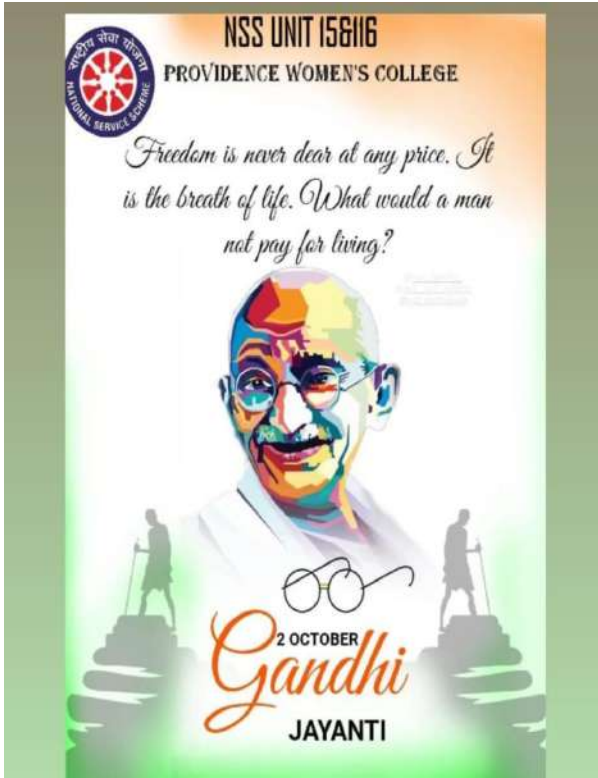
ARMONIA

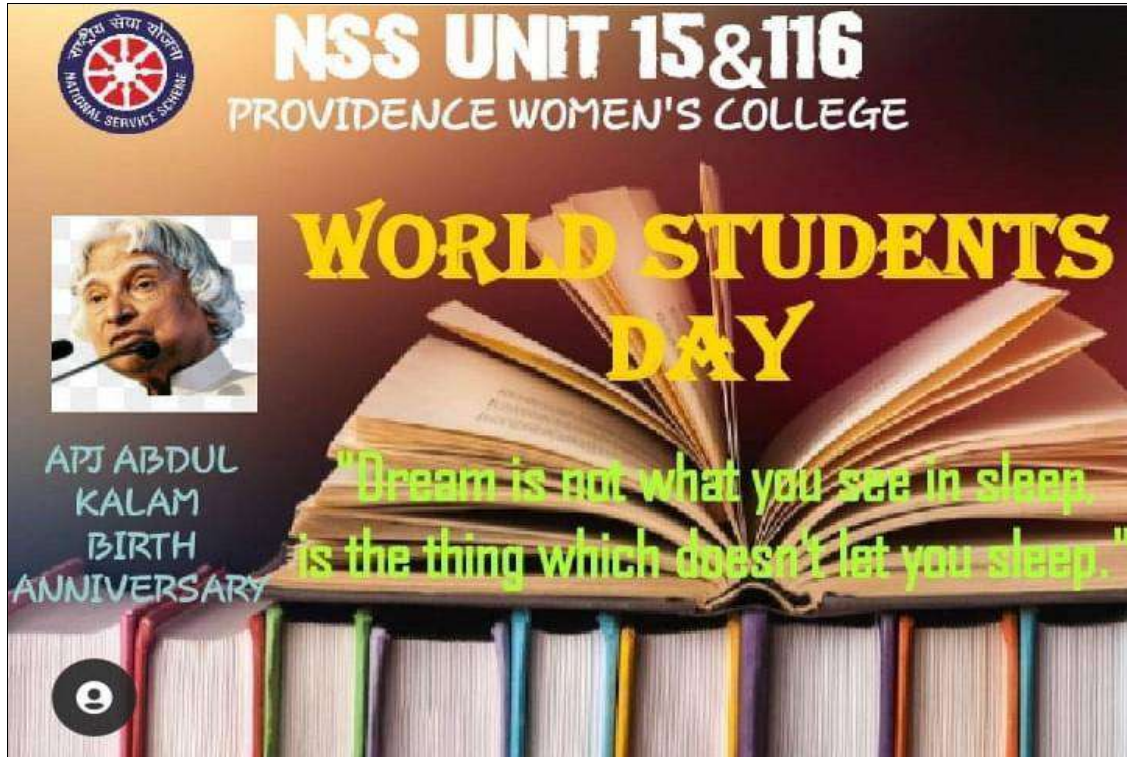
Gandhi Jayanthi

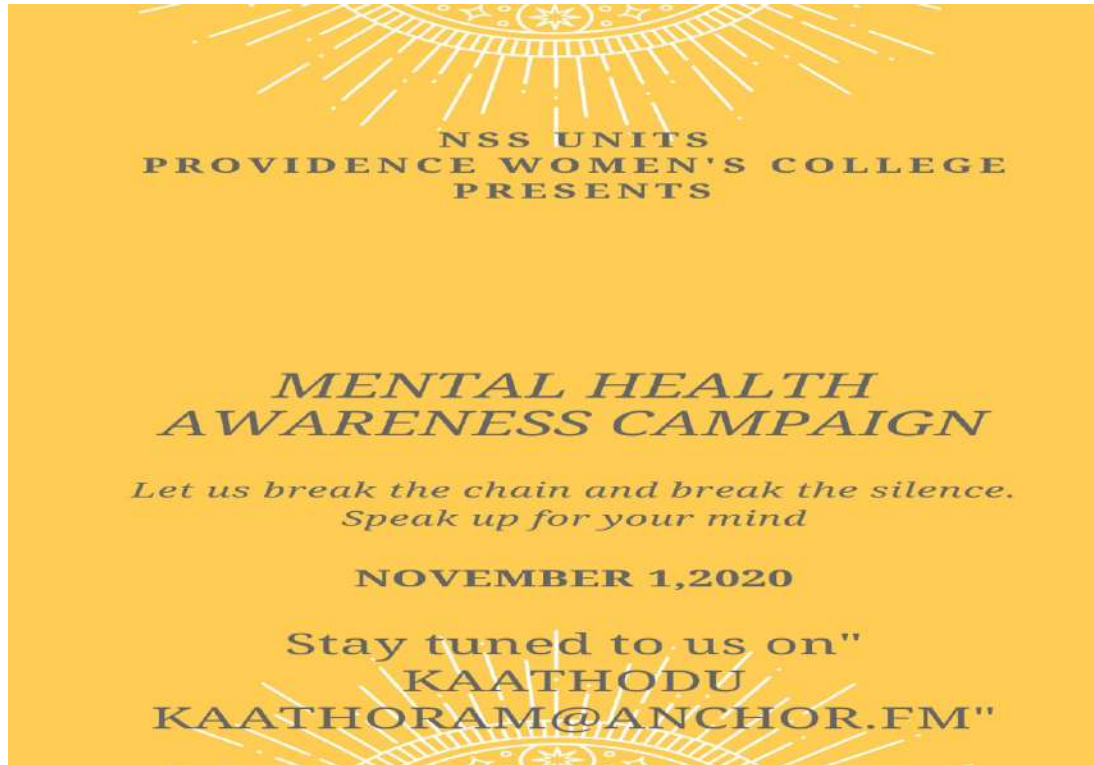
Jan Andolan

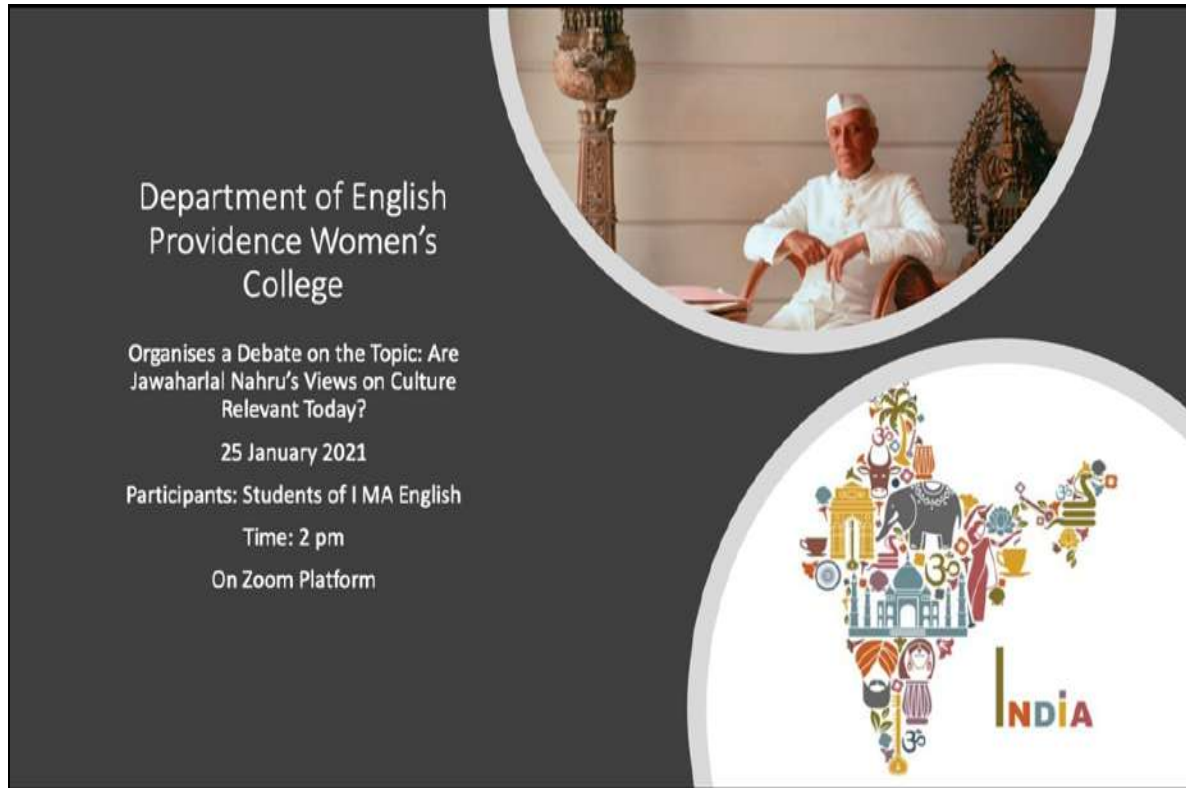
Students Day

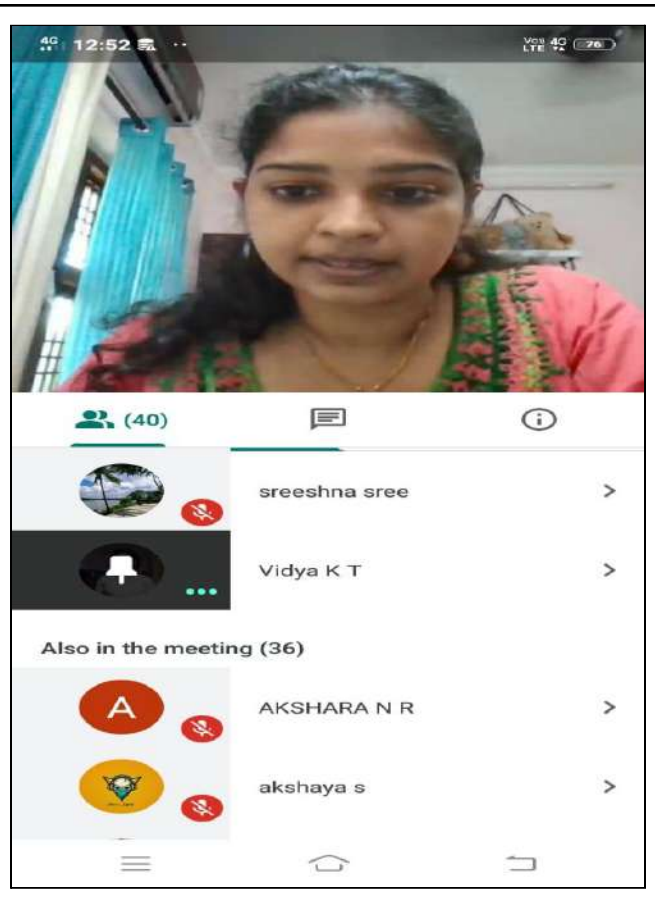
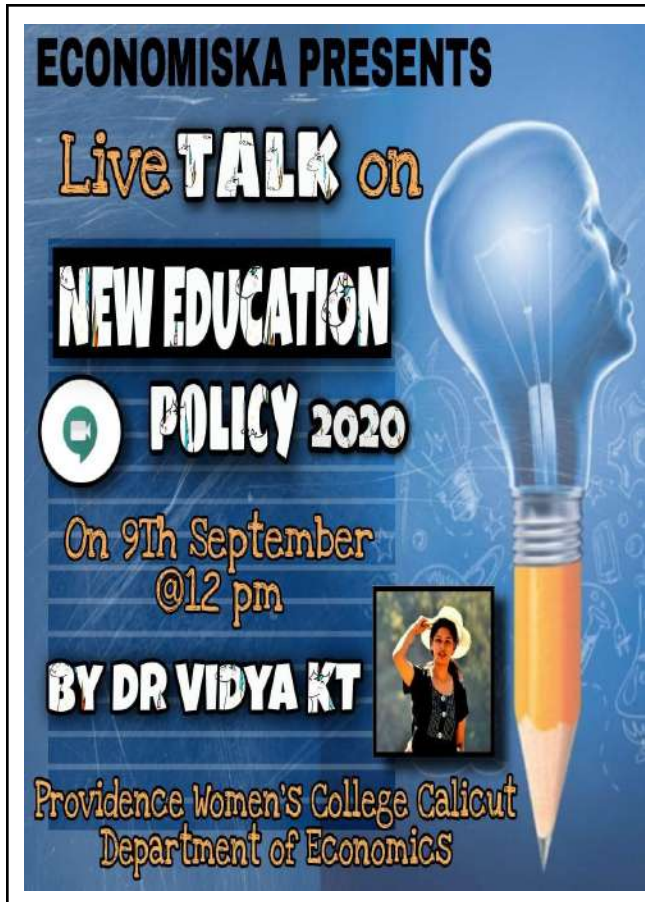
New Education Policy

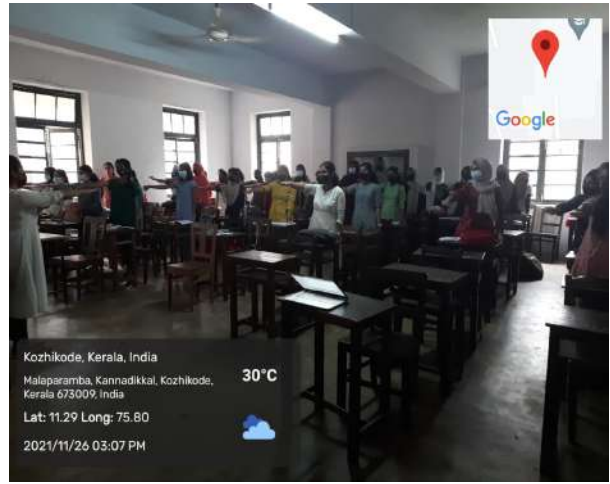
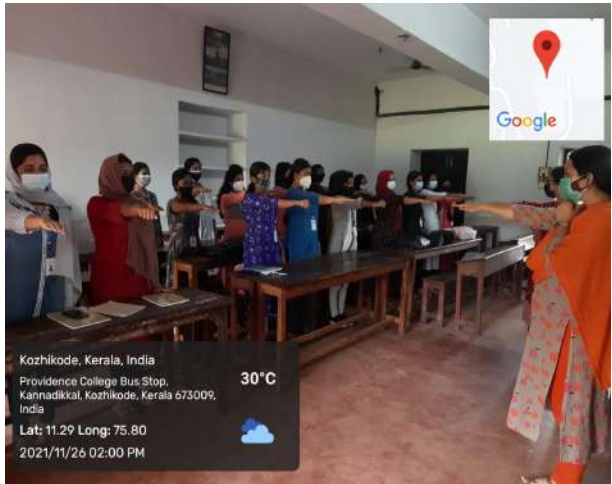
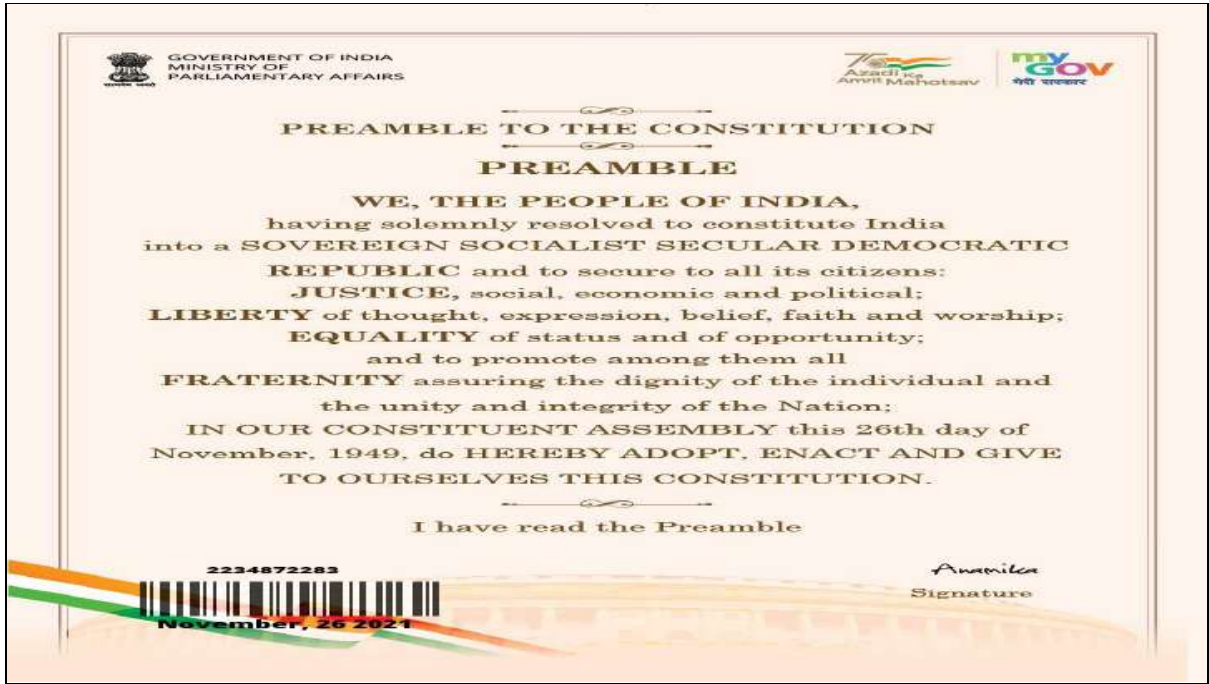
Humanitarian Day

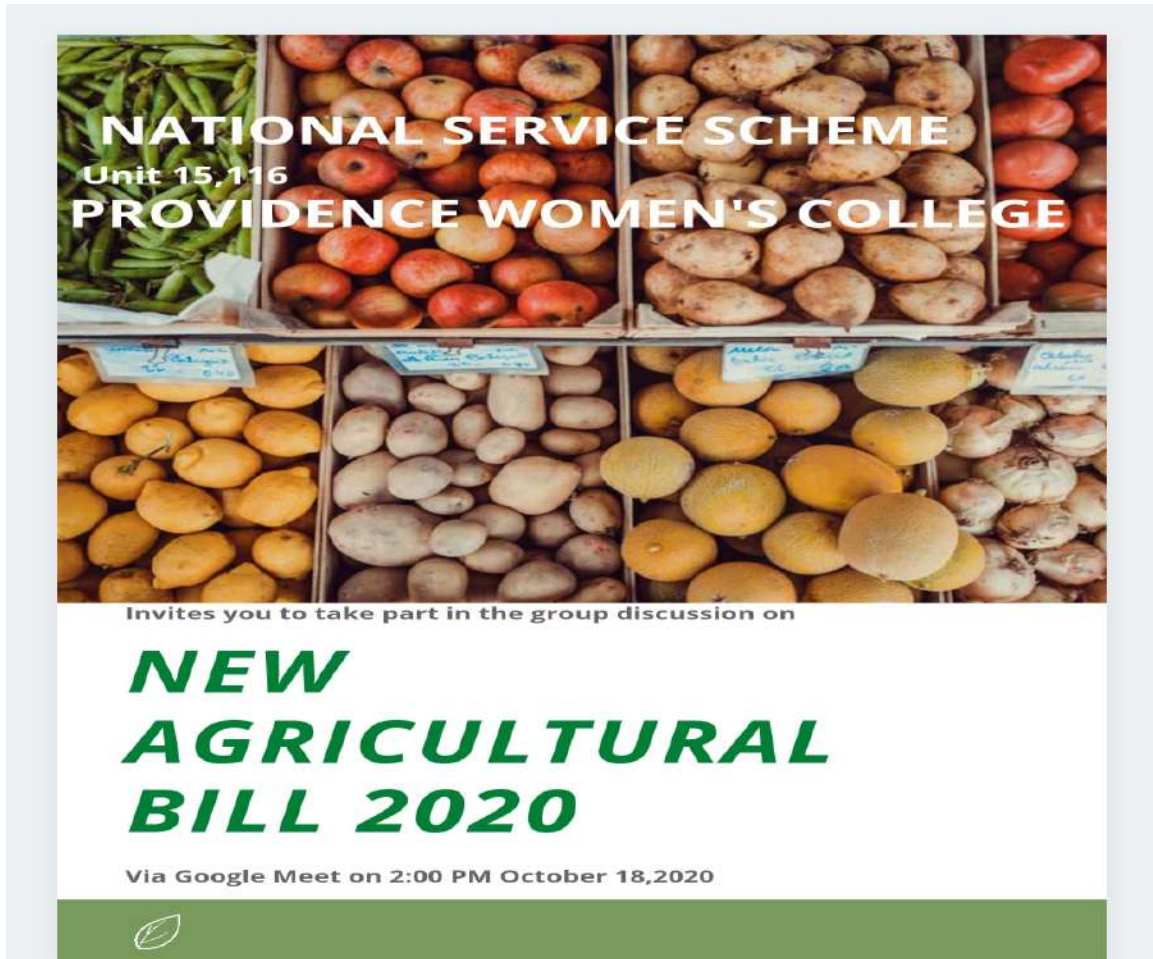
Need for New Education Policy

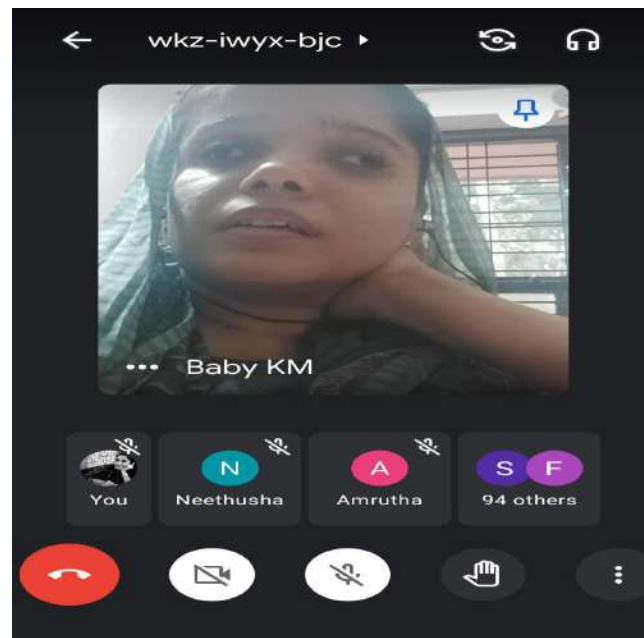
Constitutional Day

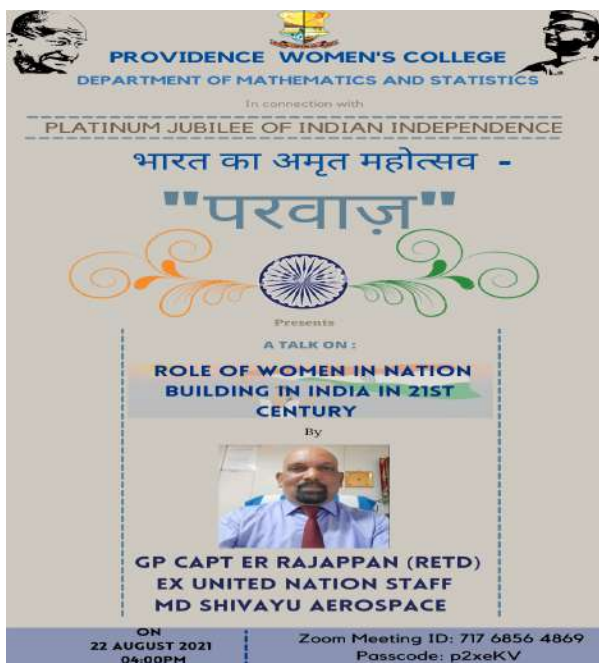
New Agriculture Bill

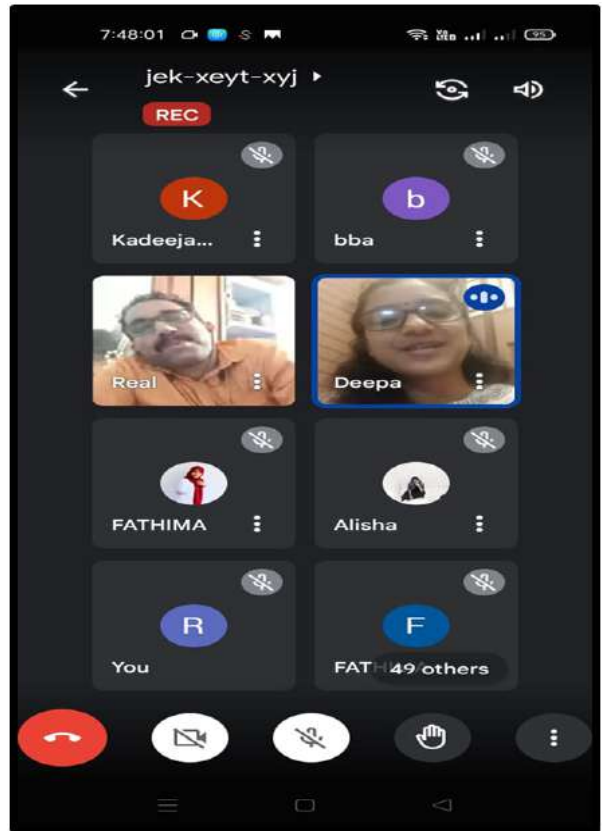
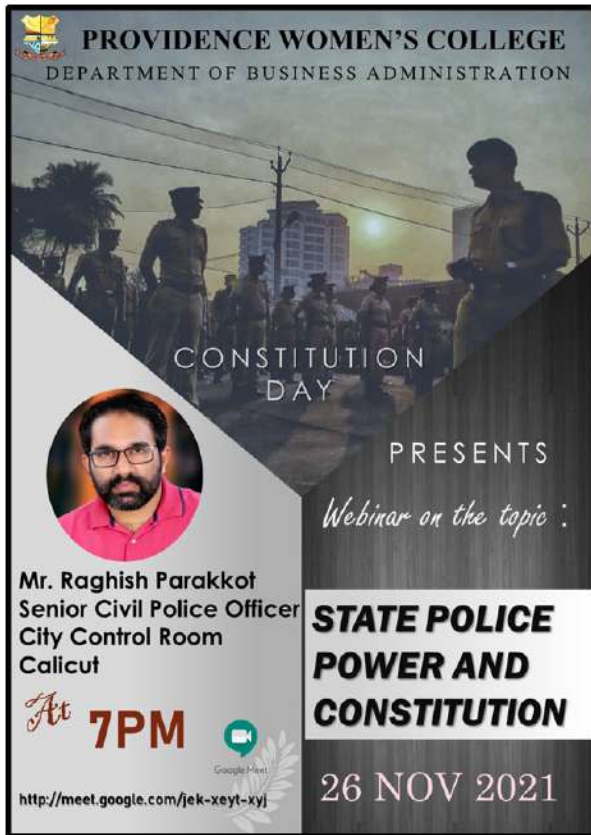
Life of a Differently Abled

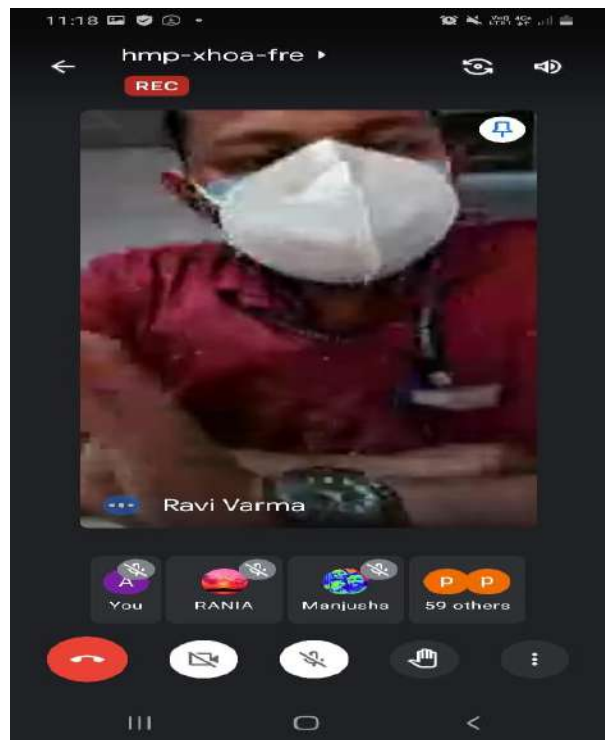
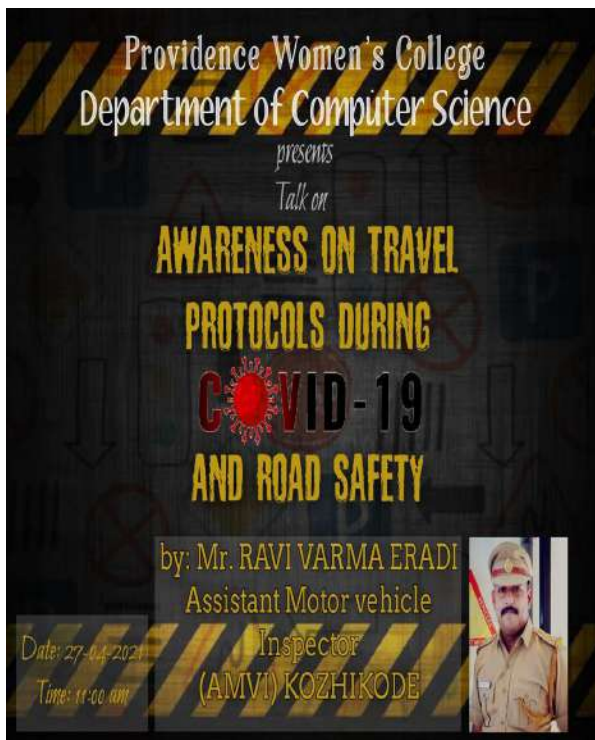


State Police Power and Constitution

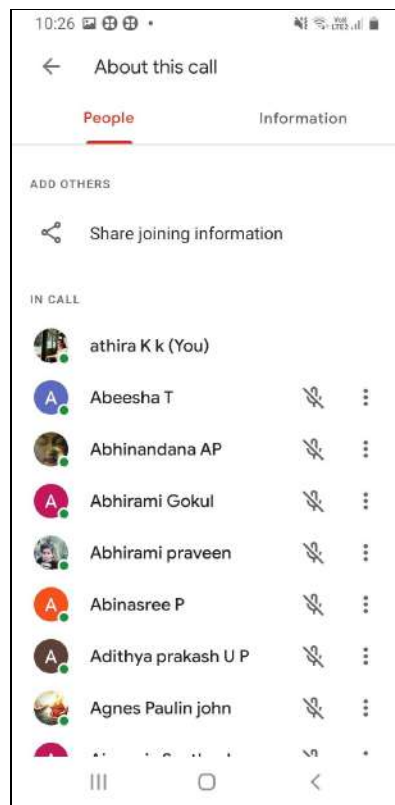
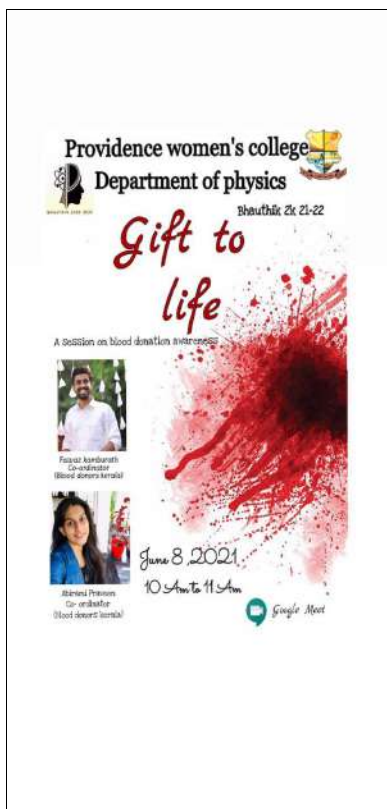
3. Duties as a citizen




Eye Donation Awareness

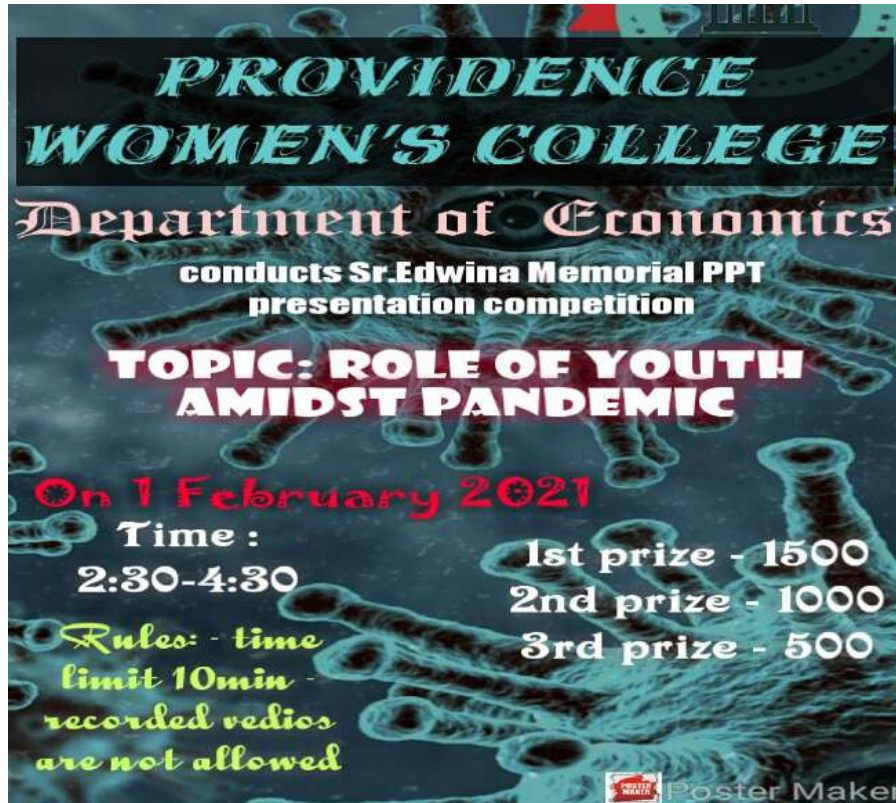

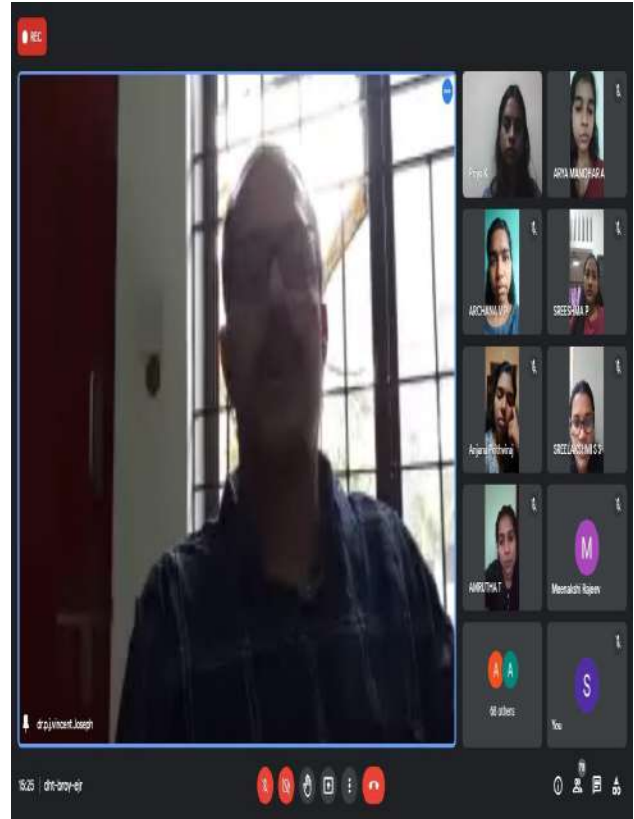
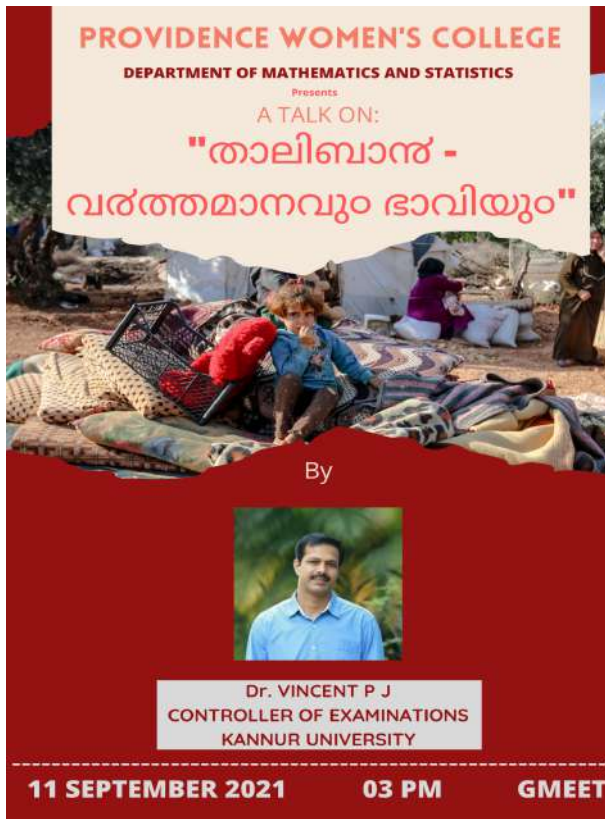
Citizen Skill Enhancement
