International Mother Language Day is a worldwide annual observance held on 21 February to promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity and to promote multilingualism. First announced by UNESCO on 17 November 1999, it was formally recognized by the United Nations General Assembly with the adoption of UN resolution 56/262 in 2002. Mother Language Day is part of a broader initiative "to promote the preservation and protection of all languages used by peoples of the world" as adopted by the UN General Assembly on 16 May 2007 in UN resolution 61/266,[3] which also established 2008 as the International Year of Languages.

The idea of connecting with the world was bought to vision by our department. We reached out and collaborated with people living in different corners of the world.

It was indeed our pleasure to have bought this idea and experiencing a bond where the only thing different is language.

People from all parts of the world sent wishes for our college, Providence Women's College and congragulated our department for the effort taken for the one week long celebration of International Mother Language Day from 17.02.2022 - 21.02.2022.

Shona is a Bantu language of the Shona people of Zimbabwe. It was codified by the colonial government in the 1950s. According to Ethnologue, Shona, comprising the Zezuru, Korekore and Karanga dialects, is spoken by about 7.5 million people.

MS. JOSEPHINE. Language : Tagalog Country : Philippines

Native Tagalog speakers form the second largest linguistic and cultural group in the Philippines and number about 14 million; they are located in central Luzon and parts of Mindanao.

MS. SEETHA. Language : Nepali Country : Nepal

The Nepali language originally belonged to the Indo-European language family which is also described as Khas Kura, the language of Khas kingdom. It originated in the western hilly region of Nepal.

Nepali language is not only the official language of Nepal but is also one of the 23 official languages of India which is spoken in the states of Sikkim and West Bengal.


