





PREAMBLE:

Constitution Day, also known as "National Law Day", is celebrated in India on 26 November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. On 26 November 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted to the Constitution of India, and it came into effect on 26 January 1950.To mark this momentous occasion, BBA department of Providence Women's College held a symposium on November 26th 2021 to commemorate the adoption of the Indian Constitution and to instill a sense of patriotism among the students.The session was conducted as a webinar on 26th November 2021 at 7 pm and was attended by 70 students,teachers and people from different sectors.


REPORT OF THE EXTENSION ACTIVITY: CLEANING AND RESTORATION OF WATER BODIES




The program named Community Related Activity is one of the extension activity of department of psychology.

A TALK ON AN INTRODUCTION TO BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY AND CONSERVATION CHALLENGES



Easa, the chairman of Aranyakam Nature foundationIUCN/SSC: Project Elephant Steering committee member. And he took a session on the topic "An Introduction To Biological Diversity And Conservation Challenges".

WILDLIFE WEEK CELEBERATION 2021-A TALK ON BIRDS OF KERALA

On 6th October a talk by Shri. Sathyan Mepayur, President of Malabar Natural History Society (MNHS) was conducted on the topic "Birds Of Kerala" and the session was inaugurated Shri. Sunil Kumar K, Asst. Conservation Of Forest, Social Forestry, Extension Division,kozhikode. The highlights of the programme was on the endemic and common birds of Kerala and their calls /songs. It was a visual and auditory treat of birdsas well as an enriched information sharing period about the habit,habitat and special features of the birds of Kerala There were above 75 participants in the session.



VISIT TO BOTANICAL GARDEN

On 19 th February bout 37 students of BSc final year students and 3 faculty members of department of zoology visited Botanical garden, Univesity of Calicut. The garden was a dedicated collection, cultivation and display of an especially wide range of plants, which were typically labelled with their botanical names. Established in 1971 in the lush green panoramic, undulating, lateritic, hummocky land of the Calicut University Campus, the Calicut University Botanical Garden (CUBG), has developed into an excellent centre of biodiversity and ex situ conservation of tropical Indian flora and exotic species. The Garden, the brainchild of Prof. B.K. Nayar, the first Head of the Department of Botany, was inaugurated in 1972 by Prof. R.E. Holttum, the then Director, Singapore Botanical Garden.In 1985 the CUBG achieved international status when it was recognized by the International Consortium of Botanic Garden and Centre for World Conservation Strategy. At the entrance on the western side, the visitors are greeted by a display map and a pair of Krishna's buttercup trees (Ficus krishnae). The Garden reception office is located close to the entrance from where the details of the garden are available to the visitors. The garden sprawls over 19.5 acres with a shallow basin encompassed by the slopping terrains except for a narrow gap on the southern side where it slides down to a small transitory reservoir, providing diverse habitats and niches for a variety of plants. The central shallow region is provided with a graceful, placid pool and an octagonal green house and avenues of Royal Palms and oil palms. The 1 km long motorable ring road from the main entrance on the western side touching the greenhouse, ginger zone, Victoria pond, northern gate, bamboosetum and rockery provides an extension to the arboretum and medicinal plant conservatory enabling a quick walk/journey through the exquisite and luxuriant vegetation of myriads of hues and fragrance.Ex situ conservation of the Rare, Endangered and Threatened (RET) plants of South India is the major thrust area of the garden. The garden also holds many curious plants such as insectivorous Nepenthes khasiana, the upside-down tree, Adansonia digitata, the giant Victoria lily, Victoria amazonica and the cannon ball tree, Couroupita guianensis.



BUTTERFLY GARDEN INAUGURATION

On March 10th an initiative of zoology department ;Verona- The Butterfly Garden was Inaugurated by Smt. R Keerthi,IFS,Conservator of Social Forestry of Northern Region. The programme was conducted in association with Social forest extension,Kozhikode. Butterflies bring movement and beauty to a sunny garden. The sight of the delicate, winged creatures flitting from flower to flower delights the young and old.Besides being important pollinators, butterflies impact the whole environment. Their welfare is increasingly compromised by loss of habitat due to deforestation and widespread pesticide use, as well as changes in climate and weather.By planting butterfly gardens, people can help conserve butterflies as well as other native insects and help perpetuate native plant species.

Butterfly gardening provides a recreational activity to view butterflies interacting with the environment. Besides anthropocentric values of butterfly gardening, creating habitat reduces the impacts of habitat fragmentation and degradation. Habitat degradation is a multivariate issue; development, increased use of pesticides and herbicides, woody encroachment, and non-native plants are contributing factors to the decline in butterfly and pollinator habitat. Pollination is one ecological service butterflies provide; about 90% of flowering plants and 35% of crops rely on animal pollination. Butterfly gardens and monarch waystations, even in developed urban areas, provide habitat that increases the diversity of butterflies and other pollinators, including bees, flies, and beetles.



ZOOLOGICAL MUSEUM VISIT :

On 19 th February 2022, the final year students of department of zoology, visited the Entomology museum -SCIENCE AND CONSERVATION .There was a total of 37 students and 3 faculty members. There was a huge collection of various types of insects of different orders, insects of medicinal importance .The most attractive collection was of butterflies, which was beautifully displayed.Dr. Sreejith Kanholi.Assistant Crator ,Department of Zoology ,gave a talk on various types of insects trapping methods , instruments and precautions needed for insect collection.



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
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
