

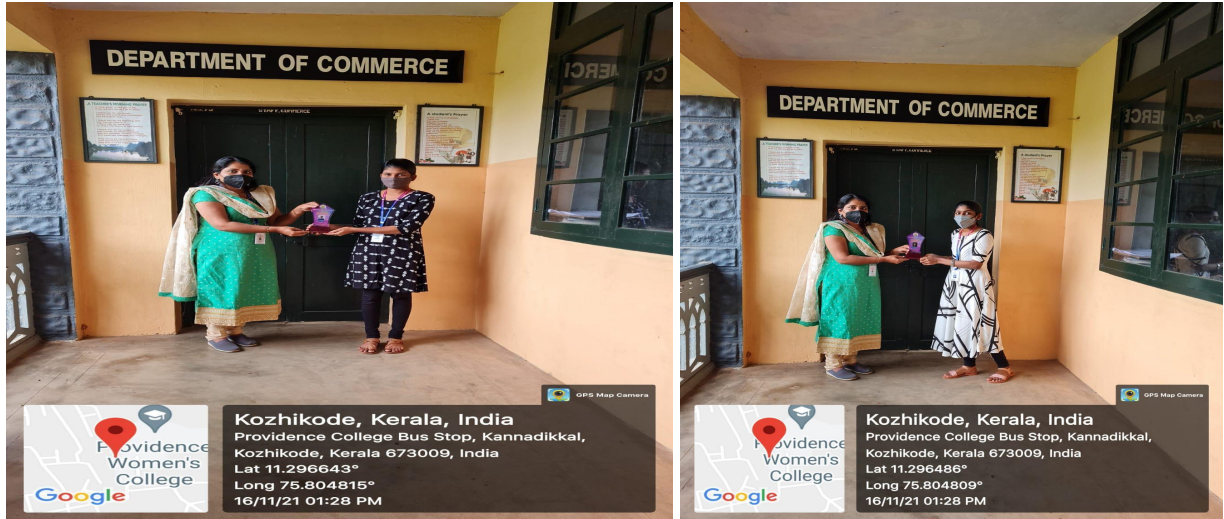

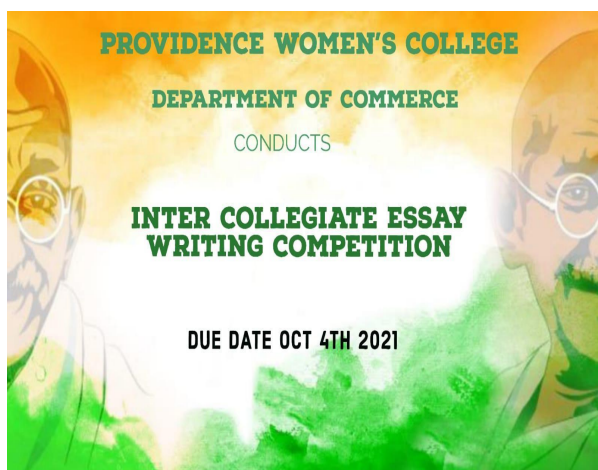

PROMINENT FEMALE FREEDOM FIGHTERS



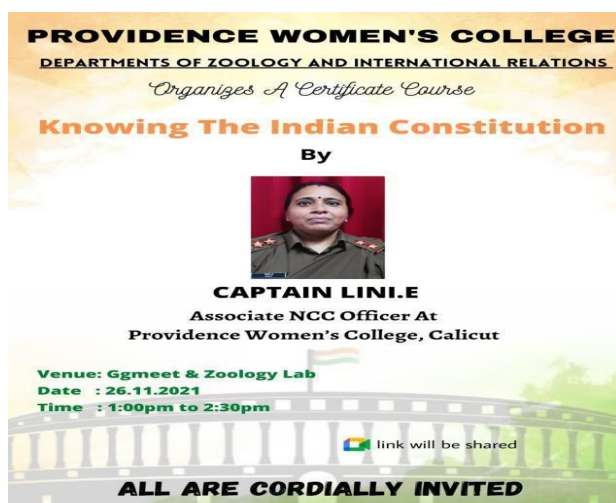

TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

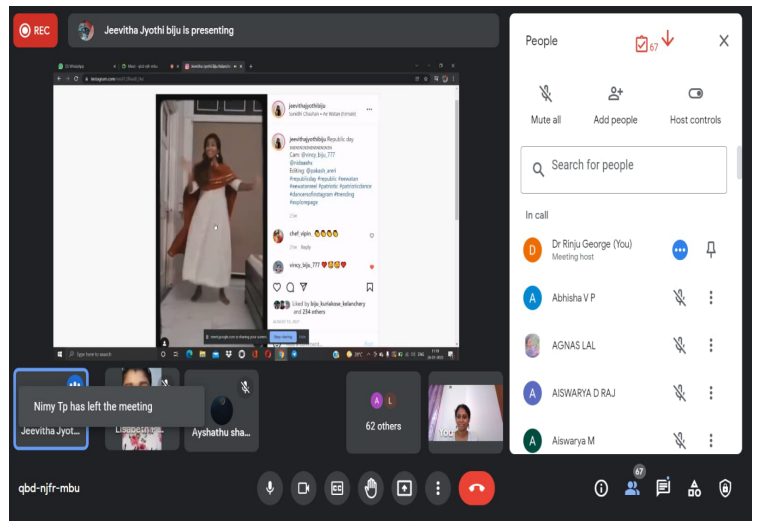
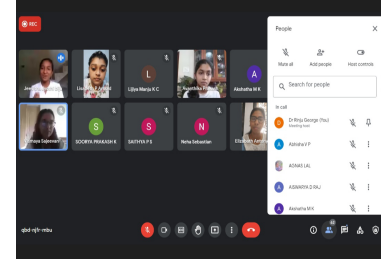
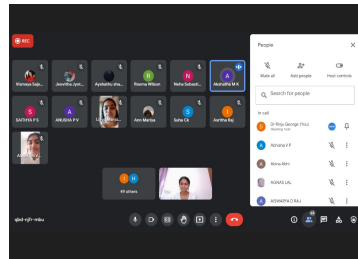
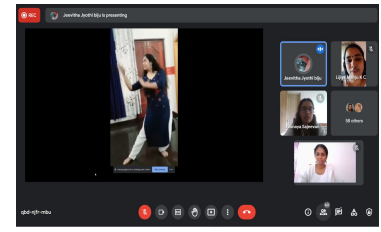
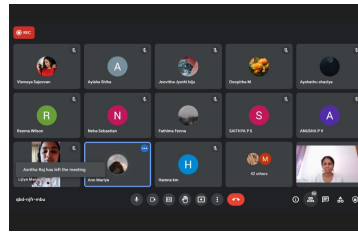

THE ROLE OF PATRIOTISM IN SHAPING ONE'S FUTURE



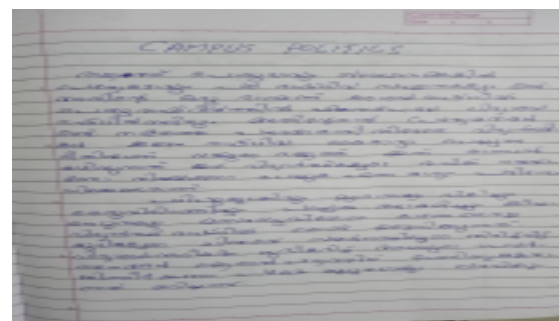
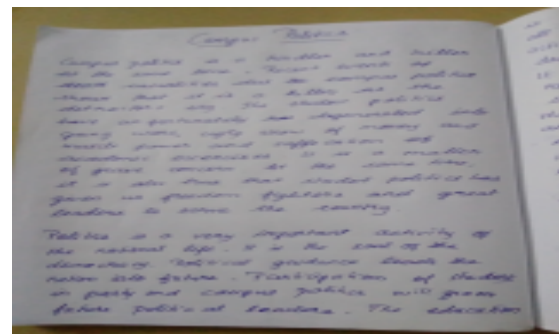
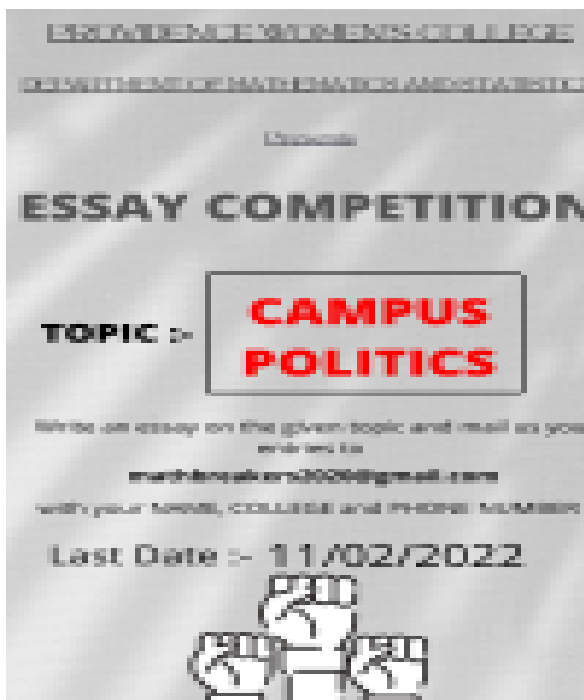

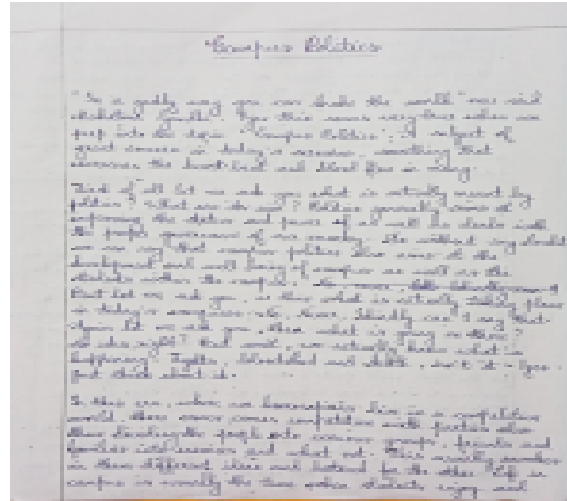
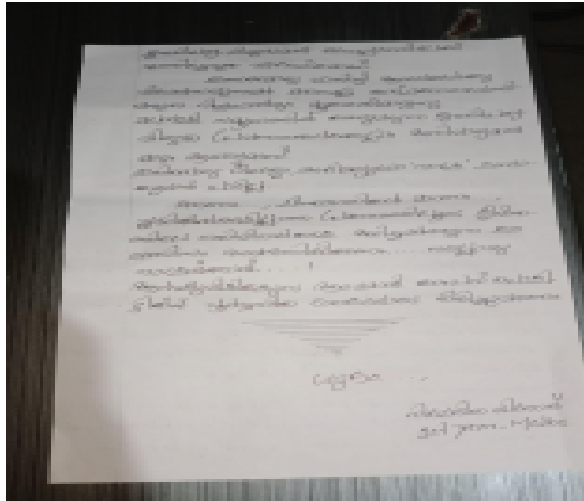
FANCY DRESS COMPETITION ON REPUBLIC DAY

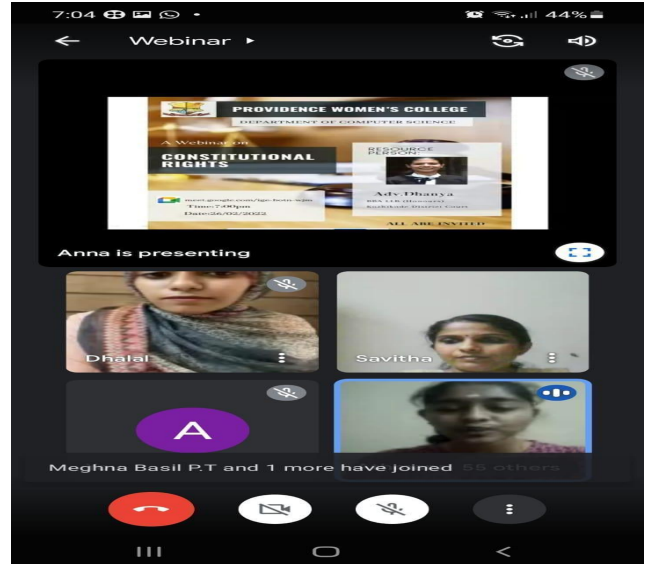
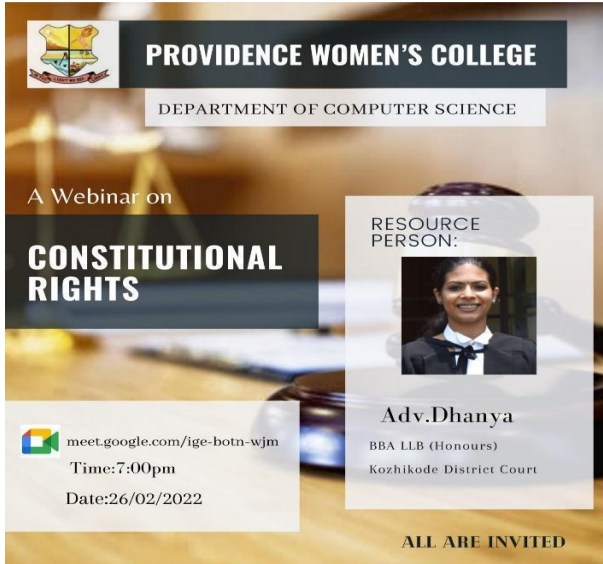
CAMPUS POLITICS

CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

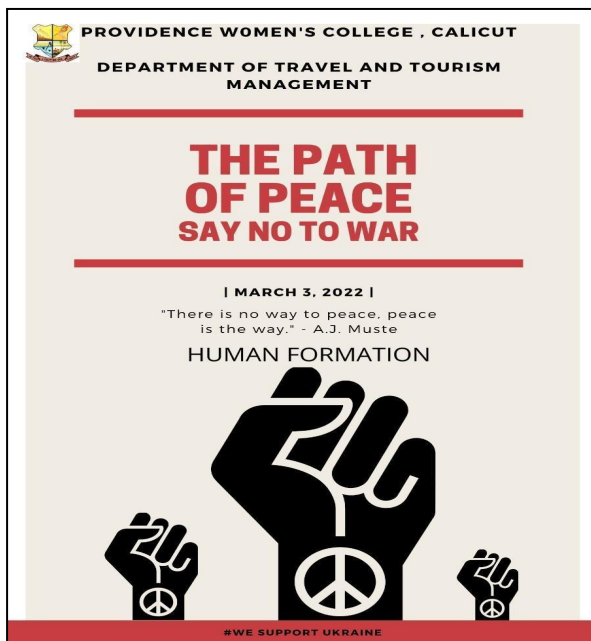

THE PATH OF PEACE: SAY NO TO WAR

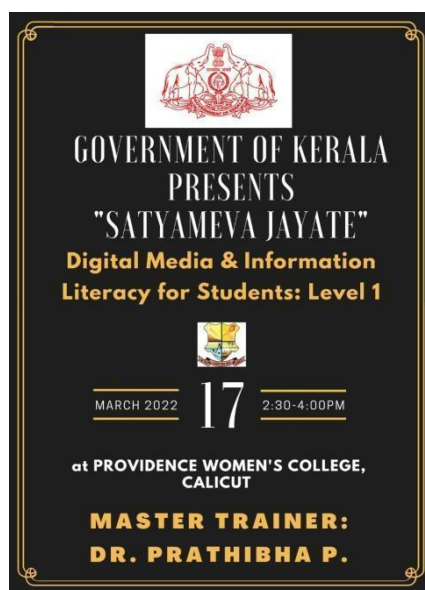
