Feedback from Employers

A Google Form was used to gather feedback from employers who hired graduates from Providence Women's College, Calicut. The survey focused on assessing the preparedness of students from various departments with particular emphasis on their academic performance, practical skills, and workplace readiness.

Workplace Ethics and Value System: Most employers observed that the students generally honored workplace ethics and value systems, although some responses indicated that certain individuals displayed this trait only "Sometimes."

Academic Performance: Employers rated the graduates' academic performance highly, with the majority providing "Good" or "Excellent" ratings. This indicated that students from Providence Women's College are well-prepared academically and meet employer expectations in terms of their knowledge base.

Positive Traits Imbibed from the College: Employers recognized various positive traits in the graduates, including analytical and logical skills, self-confidence, leadership, communication skills, and discipline. Several employers also highlighted the importance of personal empowerment, such as encouraging women to believe in their potential and independence.

Impact of Teaching Quality on Academic Quotient: Employers expressed satisfaction with the quality of teaching at the college, mentioning the development of critical thinking, communication skills, and subject knowledge. Many responses pointed to the personalized attention and supportive learning environment offered by the faculty, which contributed positively to students' overall academic performance.

Suggestions for Curriculum Improvement: Several employers suggested that the syllabus could benefit from more technical knowledge and practical application. Some emphasized the need for live experiences, practical training, and career development support like resume building and interview preparation. Others suggested making the curriculum more application-oriented or including more hands-on learning opportunities.

On the whole, the employers noted the students' analytical, communication, and leadership abilities, which greatly contribute to their workplace success. The curriculum's alignment with societal needs and the supportive learning environment were also highly appreciated. While there is room for improvement in practical training, the overall feedback reflected the college's effective role in preparing its students for professional challenges.
