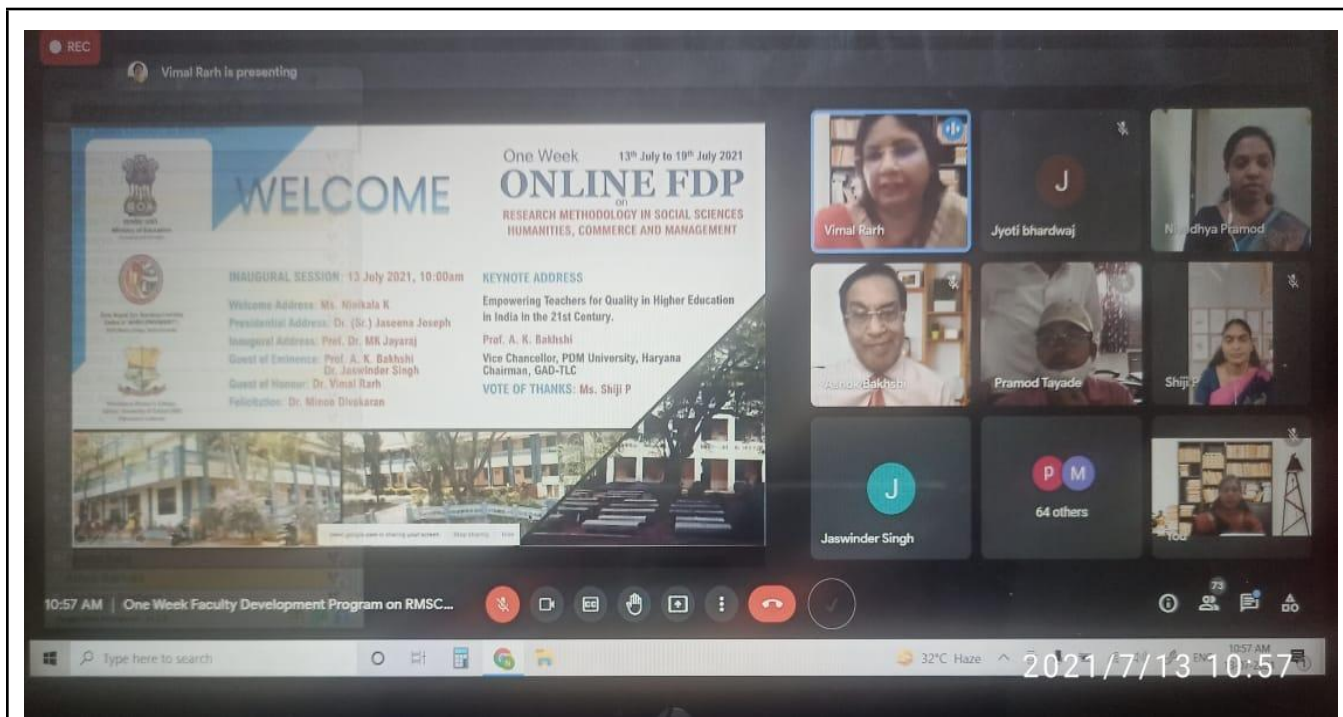

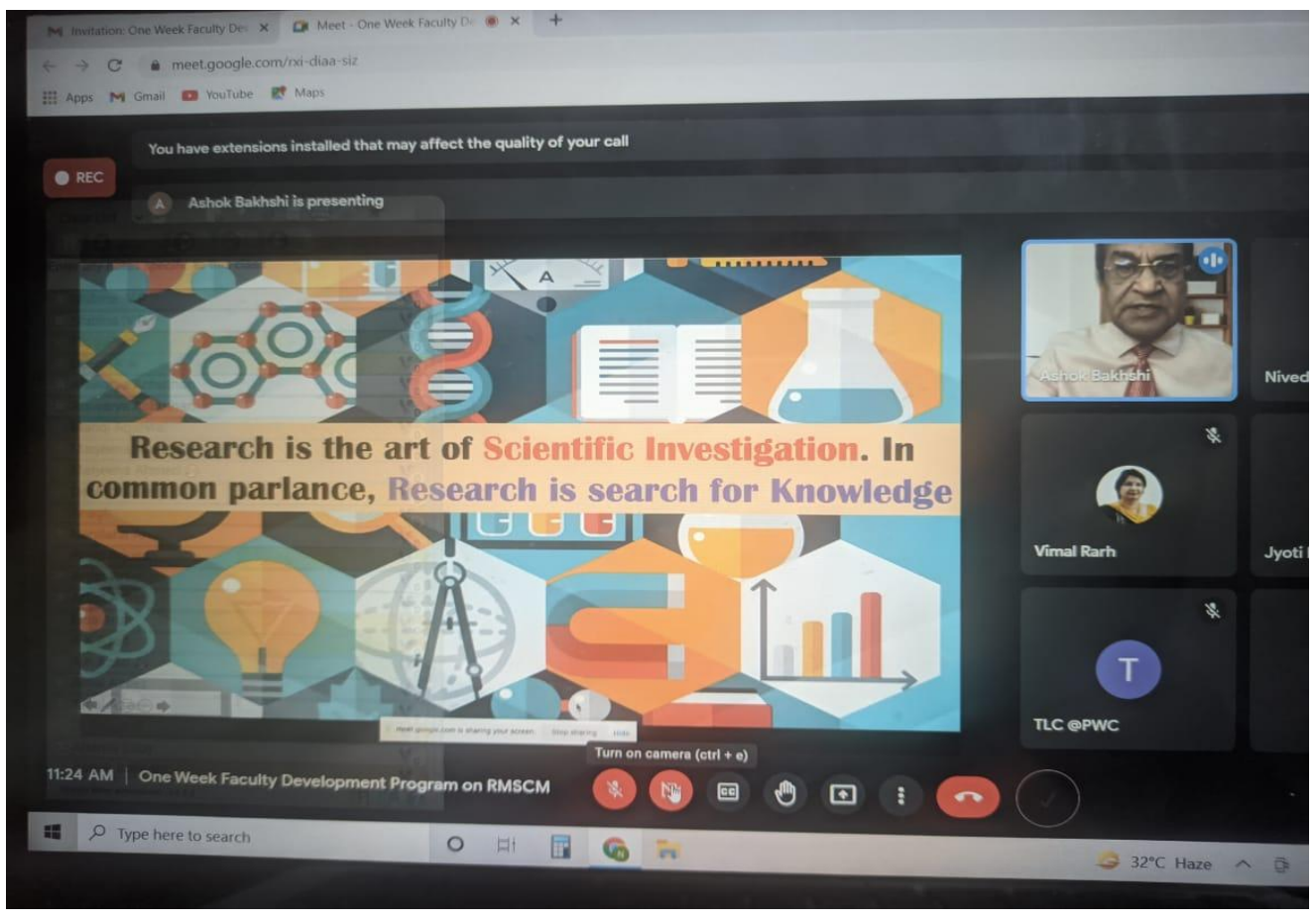
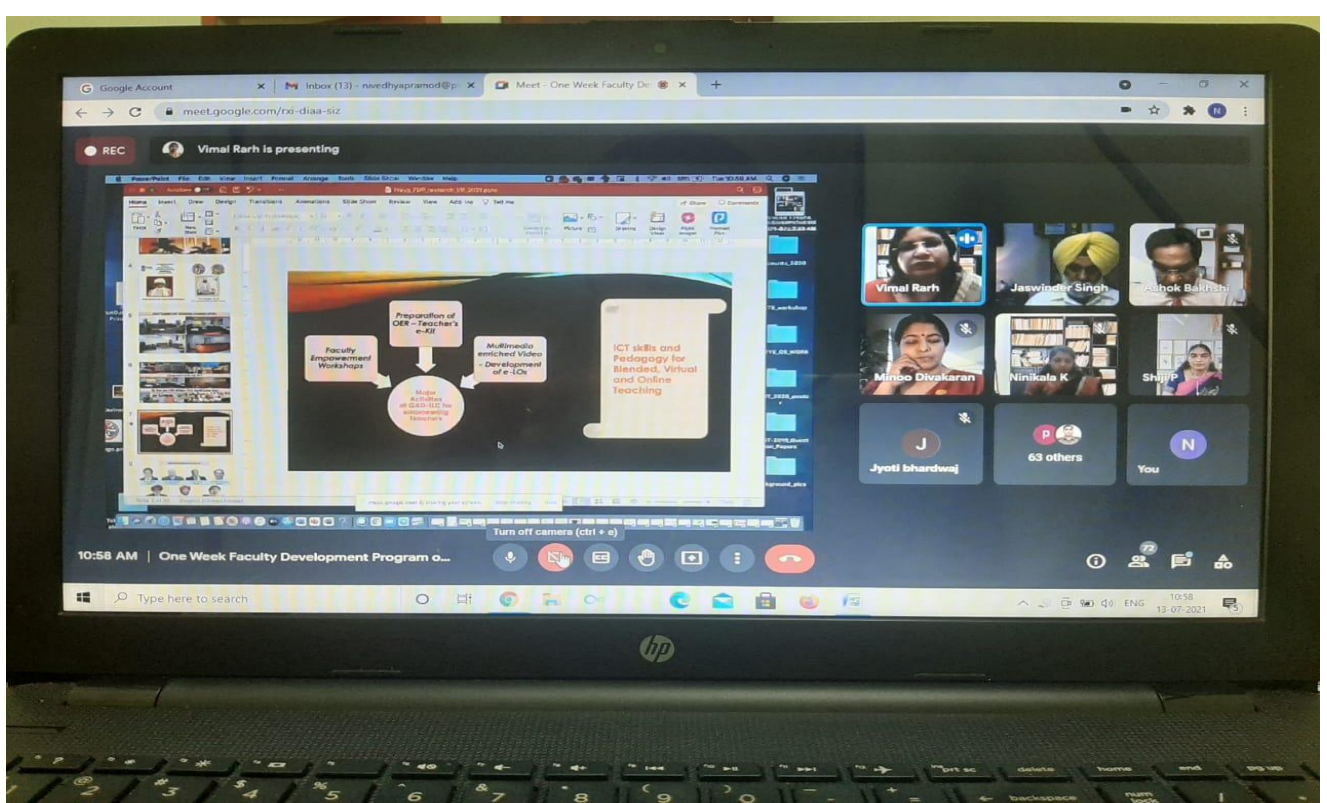
**Empowering Teachers for Quality in Higher Education in India in the 21st Century.**

The session began at 2.00pm. Ninikala K, Assistant Professor, Providence Women's College welcomed the resource Person. Session was an interactive session in which he demanded active involvement of participants.

The first session has three part:

- I) Basic of research, types of research and process or steps in research
- II) Review of literature in connection with identification of topic
- III) How could you find ( identification )problem through review of literature

On the first part detail explanation about, research meaning and various types of research, such as scientific research, quantitative research, explanatory research, experimental research etc., steps involved in a research and on the second part he moves on the significance and importance of review of literature. Second part of the session-Research gap through review of literature, was more interactive. After that he moves to the third part on the topic which is the “identification of problem”, the problem can be identified through an expanded study on the review of literature, the problem of research can be identified using various studies that have been done. The review of literature is a never ending process, it is considered to be the largest process in a research. He tried to make the three parts connected and it is also well executed, finally he concluded by saying that

review of literature is the main area for finding the topic as well as identifying the problem and the researchers should select a topic in which they have an interest otherwise, there is no use for research. Just before the winding up, the platform was opened for queries and there were a lot of queries from the side of the various participants, all the queries were well solved by the resource person. ## **Topic: Review of Literature and Gap identification**

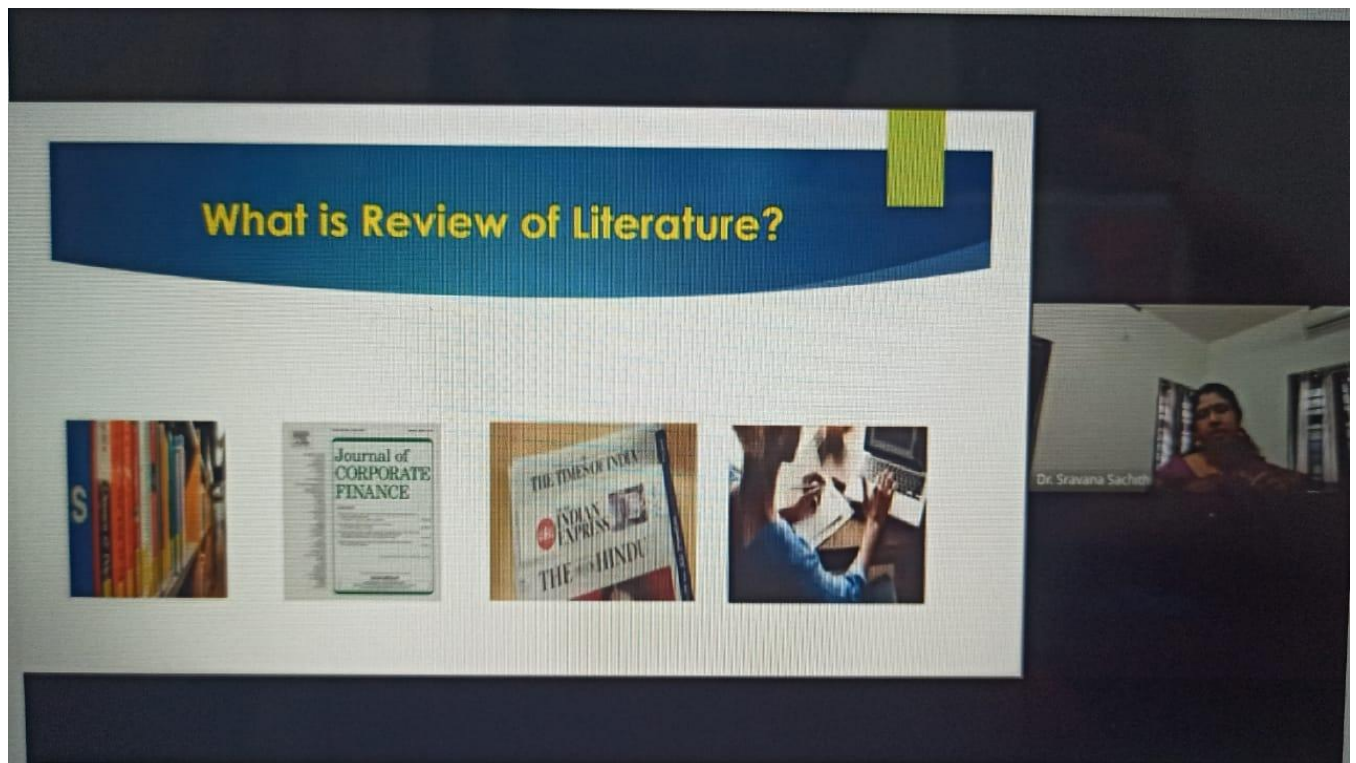
The second day of our one week faculty development programme started on morning 10.30 .The session was handled by Dr.k.Sravana, Assistant Professor in Government Arts and Science College Calicut on the topic of " Review of Literature and Gap Identification". The main parts of the session are How to review literature? How to find the Gap? What is systematic review?How to search in Google Scholar ?

Review of literature is the process of analyzing, evaluating the arguments ,findings and conclusion of others which is significant to our work.And ma'am give a suggestion about the organization of review of literature. While preparing a review of literature we should follow as per the following order, Introduction, Body, Conclusion. In the second part she started with a solution for the question "How to do Review of literature " and explained about the step by step procedure of making literature review. She also pointed out some of the free academic search engines which are used especially in social sciences for commerce and management are Google Scholar, web of science, Research Gate ,etc.

In the third part she explains about How to identify the Research Gap. Research Gap is a problem that you want to address in your research. This is a gap to fill by the proposed study.Research Gap establish the need,necessity, and urgency of your research work.No



research is possible without a research gap. she also mentioned the main reason for the identification of research gap is to prevent the unnecessary revisions from the past literatures. Next part she deals with the head systematic review. There are different types of reviews. Narrative Review, Augmentative Review , Integrative review etc. systematic review provides a complete summary of current literature about a particular problem. And in the last part of the session ,she explains how to make an advanced search in Google Scholar by showing a live search in Google Scholar. Before winding up participants raised a few queries and all were cleared. Arunima P, Research Scholar, Central University delivered a vote of thanks.

Topic: Data Analysis Planning & Execution

The session began with a query by the resource person, "When will we choose the tool correlation? Only a few participants give the right answers, Sir starts with showing the research process.

The first session of Irala sir started with some theories of research and tools for data analysis.

1. Research process.
2. Choosing of statistical Method

He discussed variables: univariate, bi- variate and multivariate analysis, ANOVA, the level of measurement and relationship between two variables are measured using

Correlation and Chi- Square is decided by looking at the level of measurements. He gave a detailed explanation on Level of measurement, What is measurement, Types of measurement like Nominal, ordinal, interval, ratio and Scaling. This was really informative to the scholars who are doing research and he also gave homework to the participants. Shobha C V, Assistant Professor, St.Joseph's Autonomous college, Devagiri delivered vote of thanks.

**Topic:** Making an impact with research: Funding source & impact factor

This session is handled by a very distinguished person Dr. Minoo Divakaran, Associate Professor & IQAC Coordinator, Providence Women's College on the topic "Making an impact with research: Funding source & impact factor"

- a) How to carry out meaningful research?
- b) Where do you get funds for doing the research?
- c) Getting funds for doing Post doc from abroad?

To carry out meaningful research we should need a supporting system such as a funding source, here in this session she was more concentrated on the fund for research. Ma'am also pointed out that, we all should be planning for doing research before the researcher gets into it. And at the conclusion of the first session, minoo ma'am ends with saying the impact of a Research in academics, also to the society.

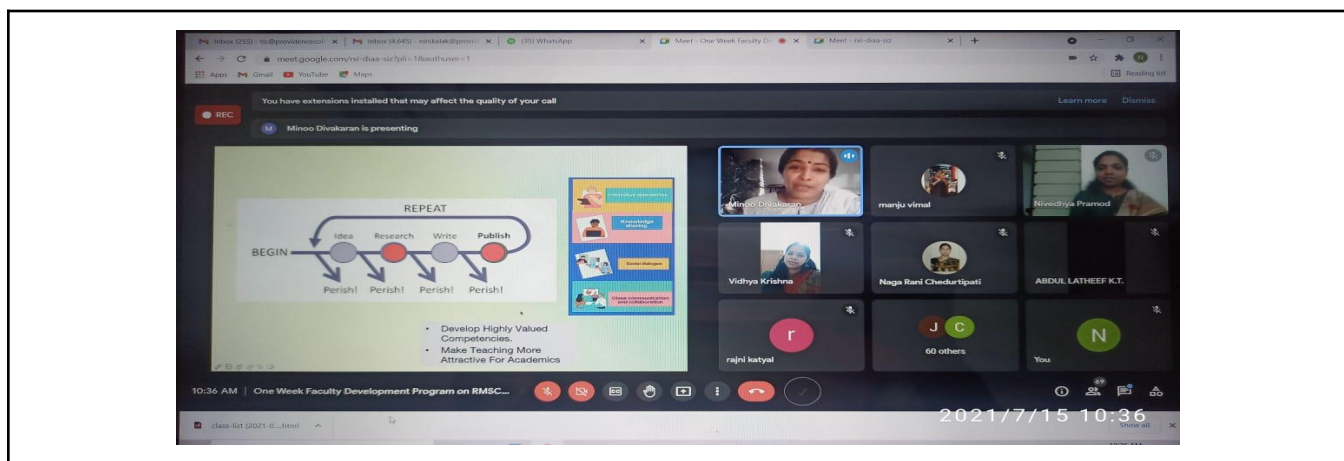
- a) Research has impact on academics when it get published in a standard journal

Research has an impact on society. (Our knowledge can reach the society through research.)

Next part of the session started with various funding sources available in India. The sources of funds in India will be available from Government, Professional organization, Private fund and Foundations. She also said these are the main supporting sources for doing the research.

In Indian research funding agencies were UGC (University Grant Commission), RBI, ICSSR etc. She also provided information on various websites' names, which was really inspiring to the participants, after that she moved to the International fund which is the third part of our session. She has given the various websites regarding the International funding agencies, such as, World Bank, Asian development bank, International food policy research institutes etc.

And on the conclusion stage she also pointed out about doing Postdoc in abroad, while having the fellowship, ma'am finally said how to go for publication and citation etc., and also the impact factor on research. One of participants, Manju C R, Assistant Professor, Sree Sankara College, Kalady deliver the vote of thanks to the resource person, she said that no FDP provided the information regarding the source of research and its impact factor, this give them the support for doing research, finally we wind up the session at right time i.e at 12.30, after filling the feedback form, they all leave the meeting, and the next session will begin on 2.00 clock.

Topic: “Research Design and Formulation of Questionnaire”

In the morning session, a lecture was delivered by Dr.Mushthaq Ahammed, Faculty, Business Administration, Umm Al Quiwan University. U.A.E. In this lecture he gives a brief overview of “Research Design and Formulation of Questionnaires' ' . He discussed different types of research design both qualitative and quantitative and within that approach there are several types of research design to choose from and he emphasized a research design should clearly define what a research will focus on. He discussed various quantitative research methods in detail. He also focused on how to design sampling methods .He mentioned probability sampling is the most statistically valid option but it's often difficult to achieve. So a researcher should always make an effort to gather a sample that is representative of the population.

He focused on questionnaires as a tool to quantify data. He further discussed various types of questionnaires that need to be done prior to designing a questionnaire and the questionnaire process. This was a very interesting session and all participants learnt a lot from this lecture.



The session was concluded by 12.30 pm to immense appreciation by participants .One of the participants, Sanchita Ghosh Chowdhury, Xavier Institute for Tribal Education (XITE) Kolhan University, delivered a vote of thanks.

Topic: Plagiarism



The session began at 2 pm by making a welcome address to the resource person by Ragi P, Assistant Professor, Providence Women's College. The session was handled by

Mr. Rishikesh K B on the topic "Plagiarism". The session started with an observation made by Mark Twain - "if you tell the truth, you don't have to remember anything". And he has applied that statement in the context of life as well as research. If you are telling the truth we can live every moment without fear of getting caught, if you are writing the truth you can live without the question of plagiarism being raised or being pointed at you.

He has shared different activities through [www.menti.com](http://www.menti.com) for the participants to get the exact meaning of plagiarism. Simplest meaning of Plagiarism is when you pass off other people's text as your own.

Sir also mentioned some tricks (plagiarism) scholars play.

«Copy texts from several sources and paste.

«Change alternative sentences.

«Copy text from several sources and use 1-2 connecting sentences between the two.

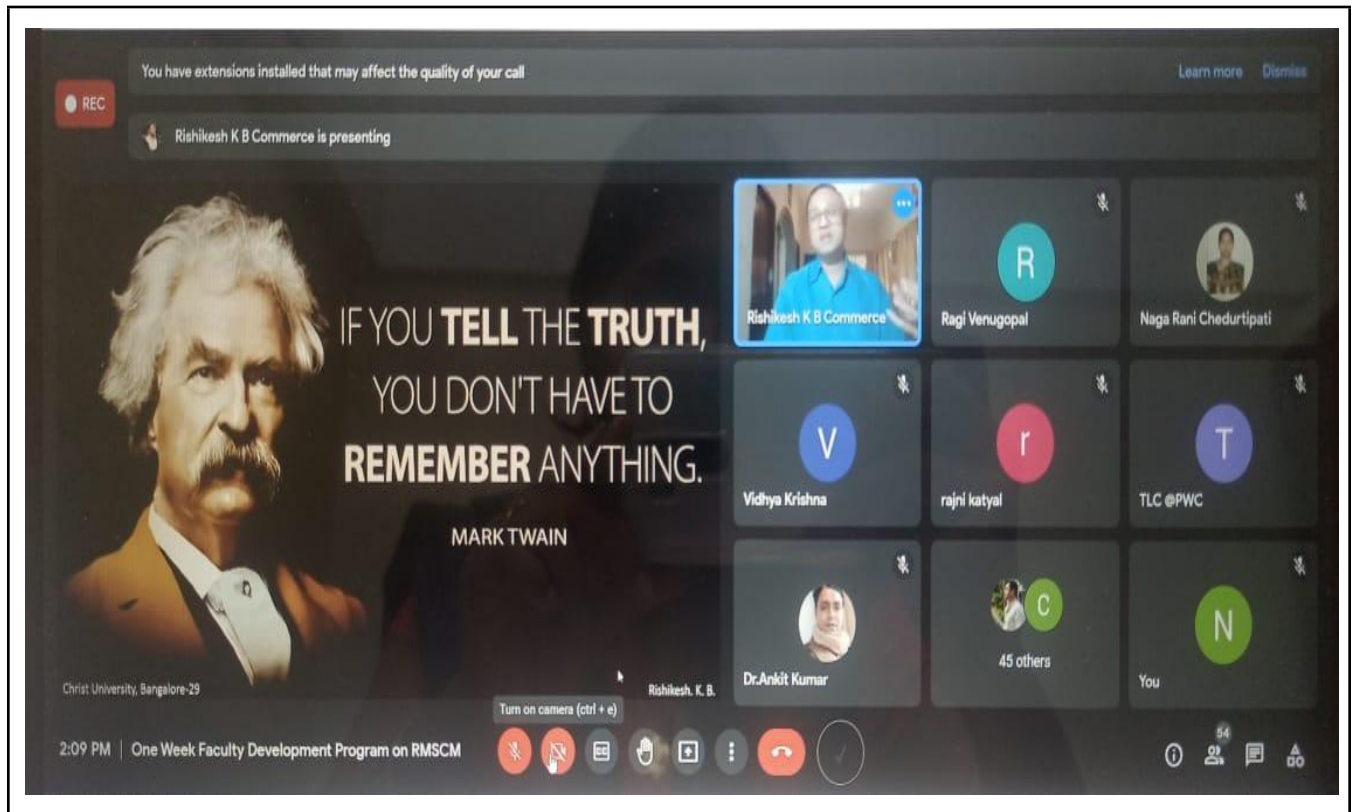
«Use software in an unethical manner .eg; spinning, etc

«Ghost writing- get the paper written by someone else.

«Change the citation for disguising others.

He points out different types of plagiarism: Direct plagiarism, self plagiarism, mosaic plagiarism and accidental plagiarism, etc. and discusses reasons for why people do plagiarism are ignorance, poor time management, lack of research skills, Deliberate cheating etc. The last part of the session he started with a statement that "ignorance of law is not an excuse". How can we avoid plagiarism? Whenever you start to write a Research paper write as your own and create a research diary. Research diary is a documentation of your research work and it acts as a blueprint of your research work. He spoke about three terms to avoid plagiarism: quotation, paraphrasing, summarisation.

This was an informative session to all participants. After the session we move on to the interactive session, where the participants clarify all their doubts. It was handled by resource person Mr. Rishikesh sir.

Dr.B.Johnson focused on Research Publication and various aspects to be considered while writing research papers. He explained the structure of the research paper in detail.

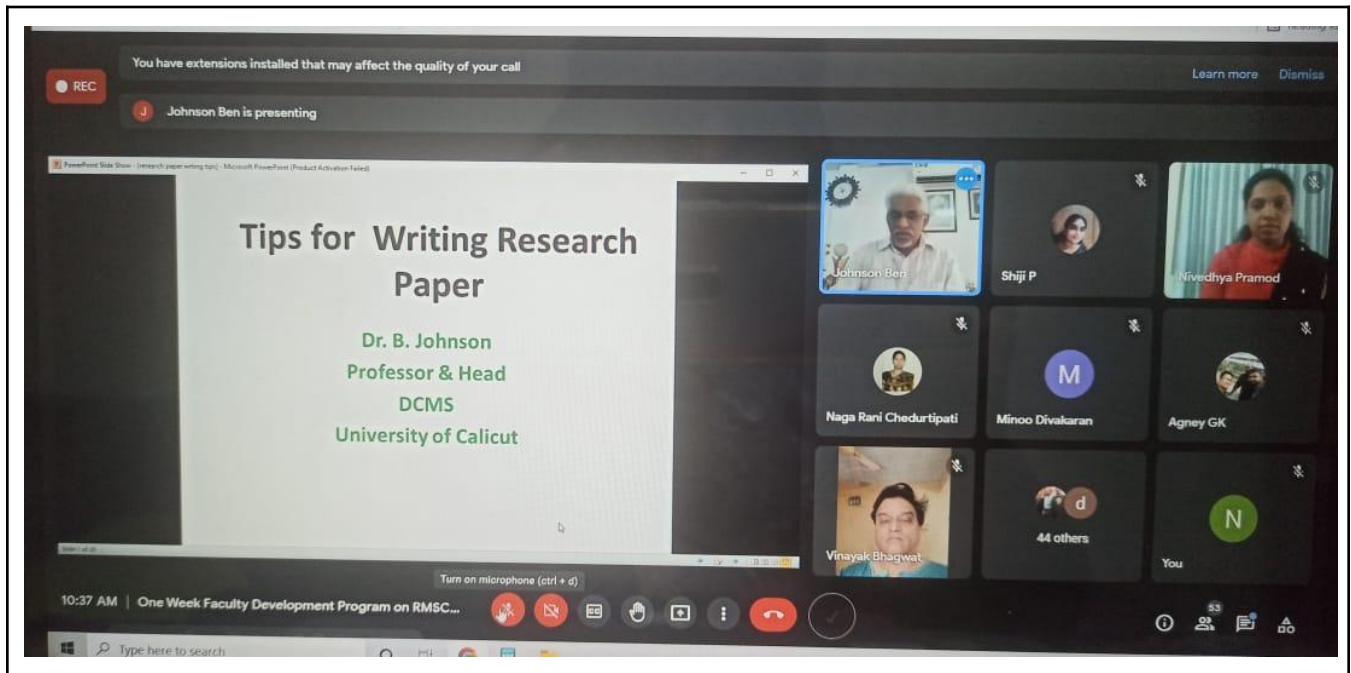
A good research paper must have the following structure.

3. Introduction
4. Literature Review
5. Results
6. Discussions
7. Reference
8. Appendix

1. What is the problem that is addressed?
2. Why is it important?
3. How did the research problem study?
4. What are the results?
5. What are the implications of the results?
6. What are the recommendations for further studies?

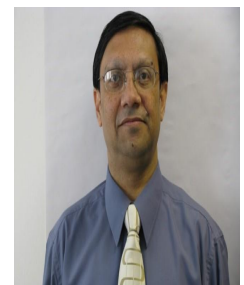

Topic: Social Innovation

The last technical session of FDP on 19/07/2021 is more informative and we have a vibrant resource person from IIM Calicut, “Social Innovations” by Professor Sumit Mitra. Dr Minoo Divakaran, IQAC Coordinator, Providence Women’s College welcomed the resource person. Few videos and documents were shared with participants on Saturday and they were asked to go through all the work and come with the queries to make the session an interactive one. He discussed about the eradication of poverty in Kerala, sir mention that the rural area can be developed only through self-employment, so on the first part, he talk about how to start a business by self, which concentrate on social entrepreneurship, sumit sir has try to connect how to implement social innovation during covid time. Society should play a major role for further development of the economy, there is an immense need of social services like health education and sanitation



especially in rural and under developed areas. He also said that there is no ready-made solution to solve this problem using innovative ideas, in between the participants have doubts for that matter. Sir has points of various innovations happening in the field of stove, gas etc., but he doubts whether it is affordable to the public, he asks suggestions from the participants, how could we make this innovation in the society affordable to rural areas. Now in the next part he described the critical issue with the stove, where he pointed out health, safety, and easy to cook, regarding the new innovation of the stove in households. Since it was the final session of our one week online FDP, everyone is very curious about this session, sir has presented a lot of information and videos regarding stove innovation, the usual lifestyle of women, how that affects the society and how it is helpful to them.

He concluded by saying that for women, business is a very big task, they require the support from society and from the government. Otherwise growth of the economy is not possible. He also talks about the hindrance faced by the management while entering into the business field, sumit also points out why SE (social entrepreneur) is unique. This session had so much extended coverage regarding the topic “social innovation”, all participants put in more queries for interaction, the session ended at 4.00 pm.
