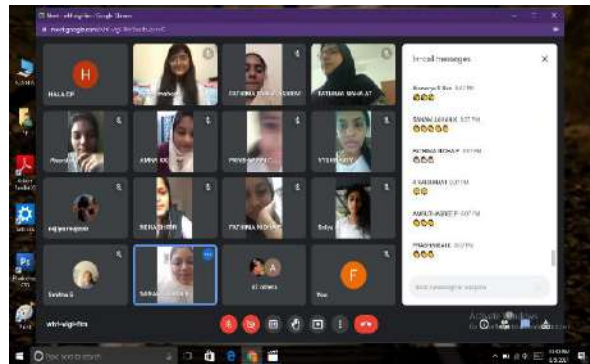
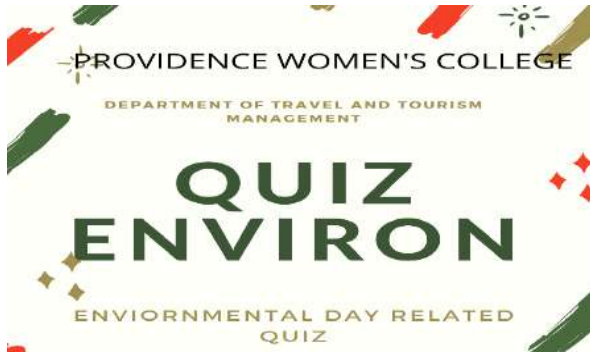

INTRODUCTION

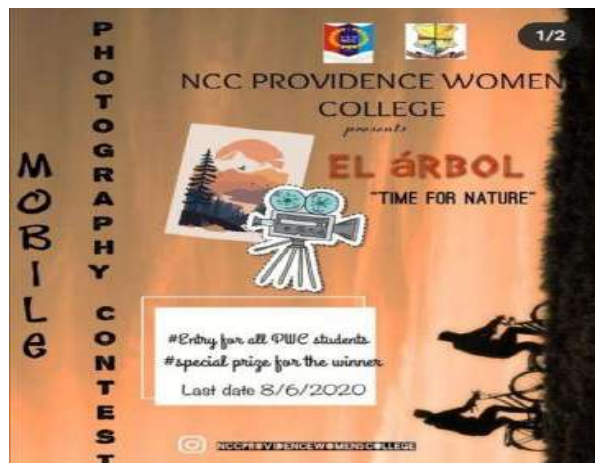

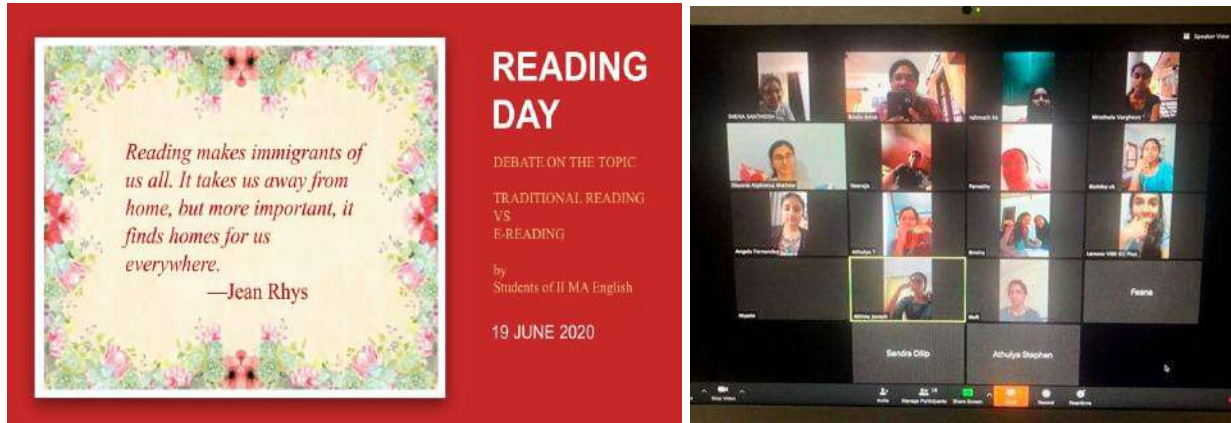

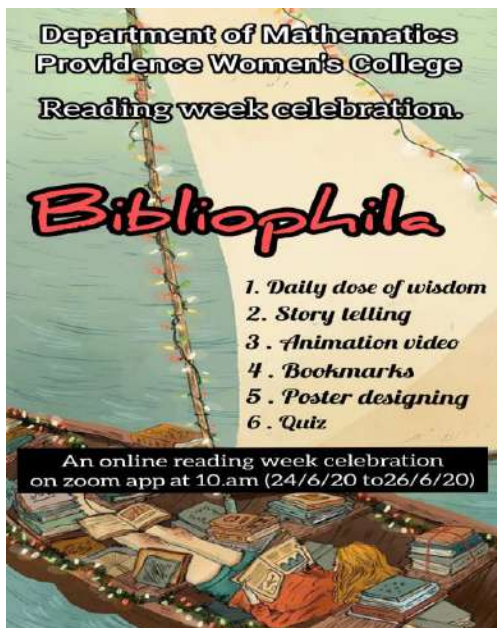


READING DAY - 19 JUNE 2020

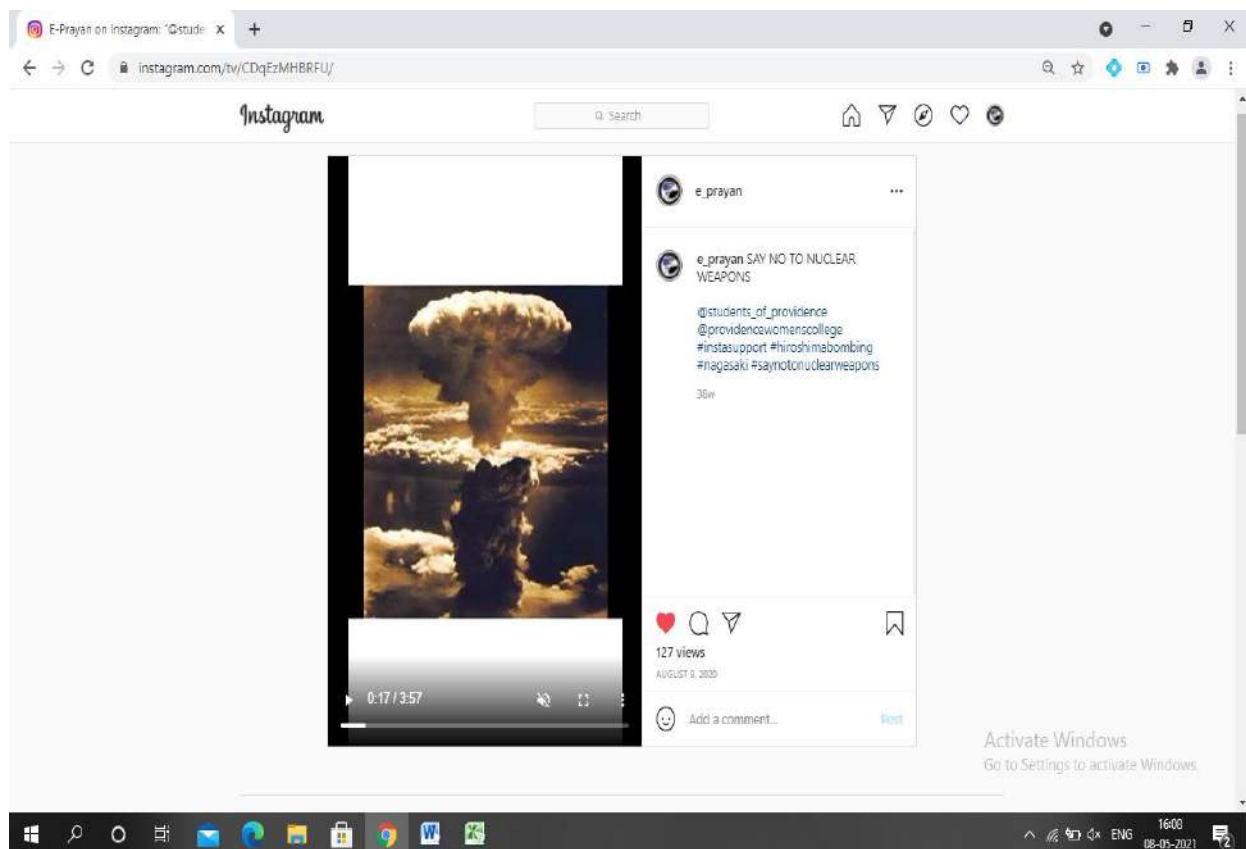


HIROSHIMA AND NAGASAKI DAY- 6 AUGUST 2020

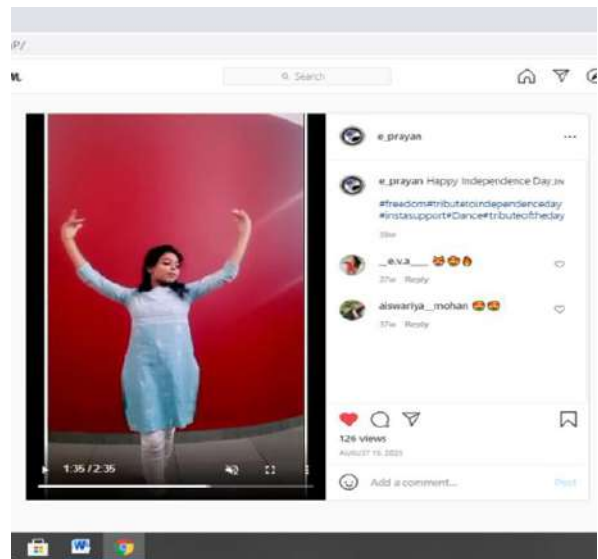
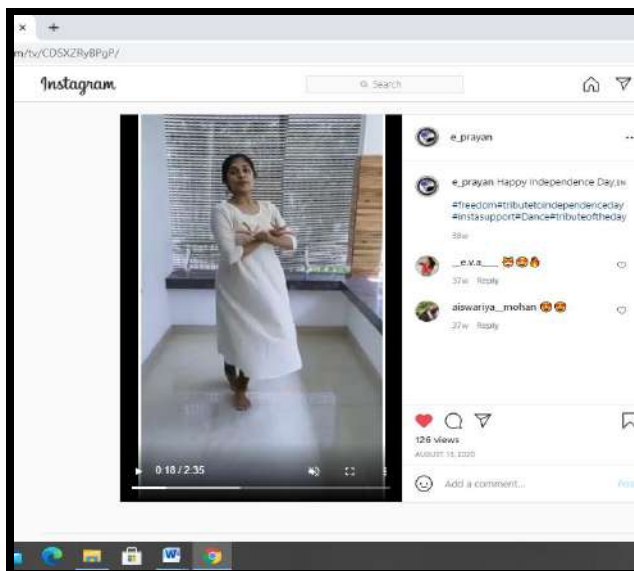
- On Aug 9, we conducted an online quiz competition for students of Providence Women's college

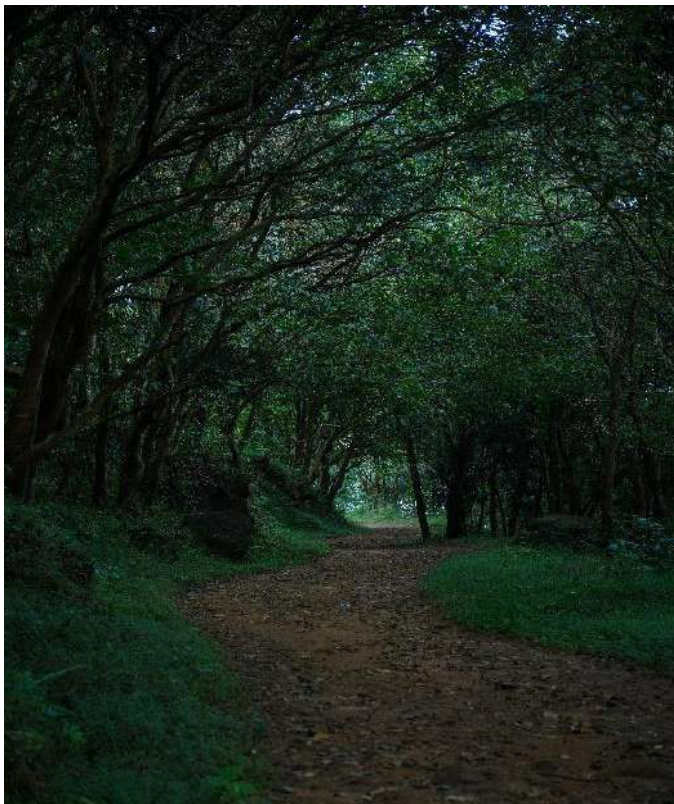
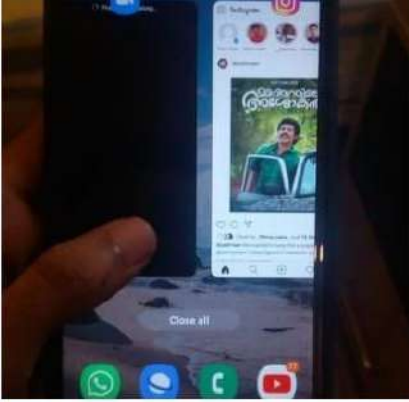



WORLD MOSQUITO DAY- 20 AUGUST 2020

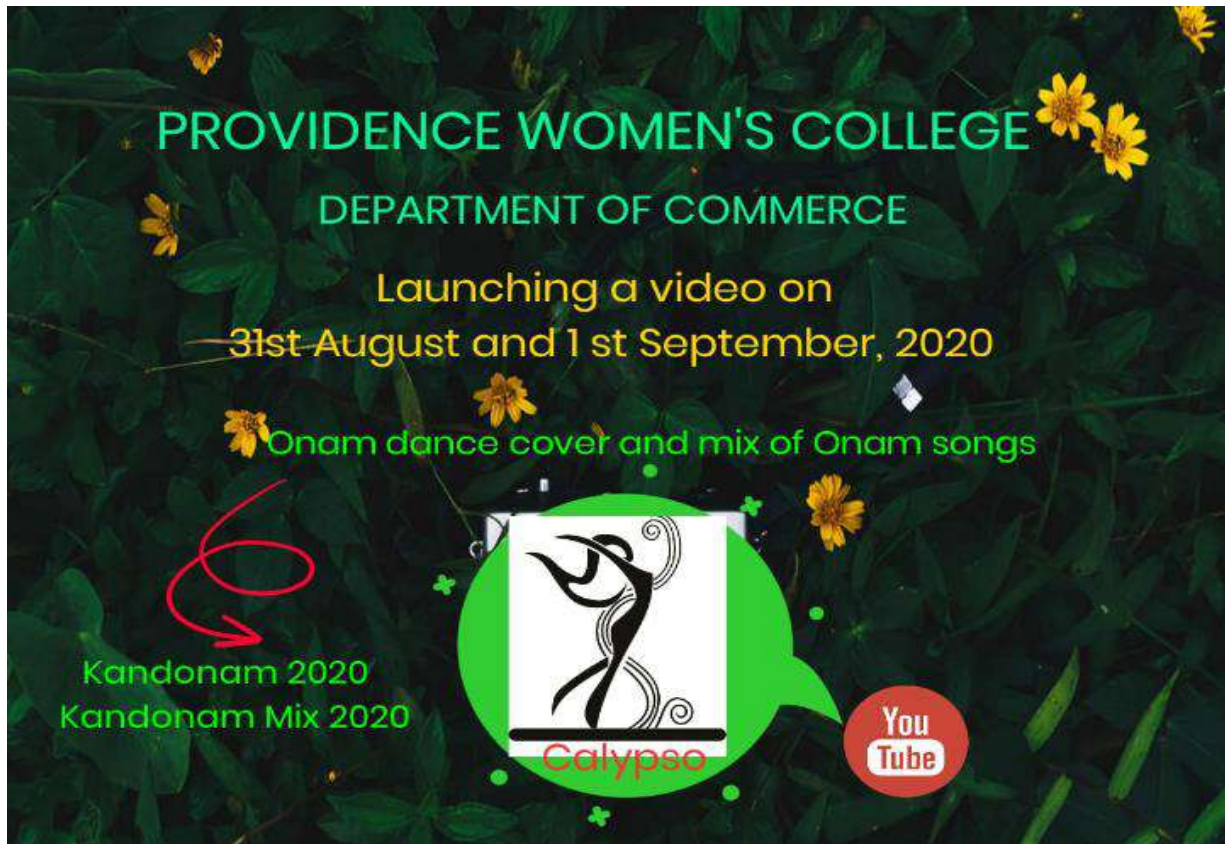

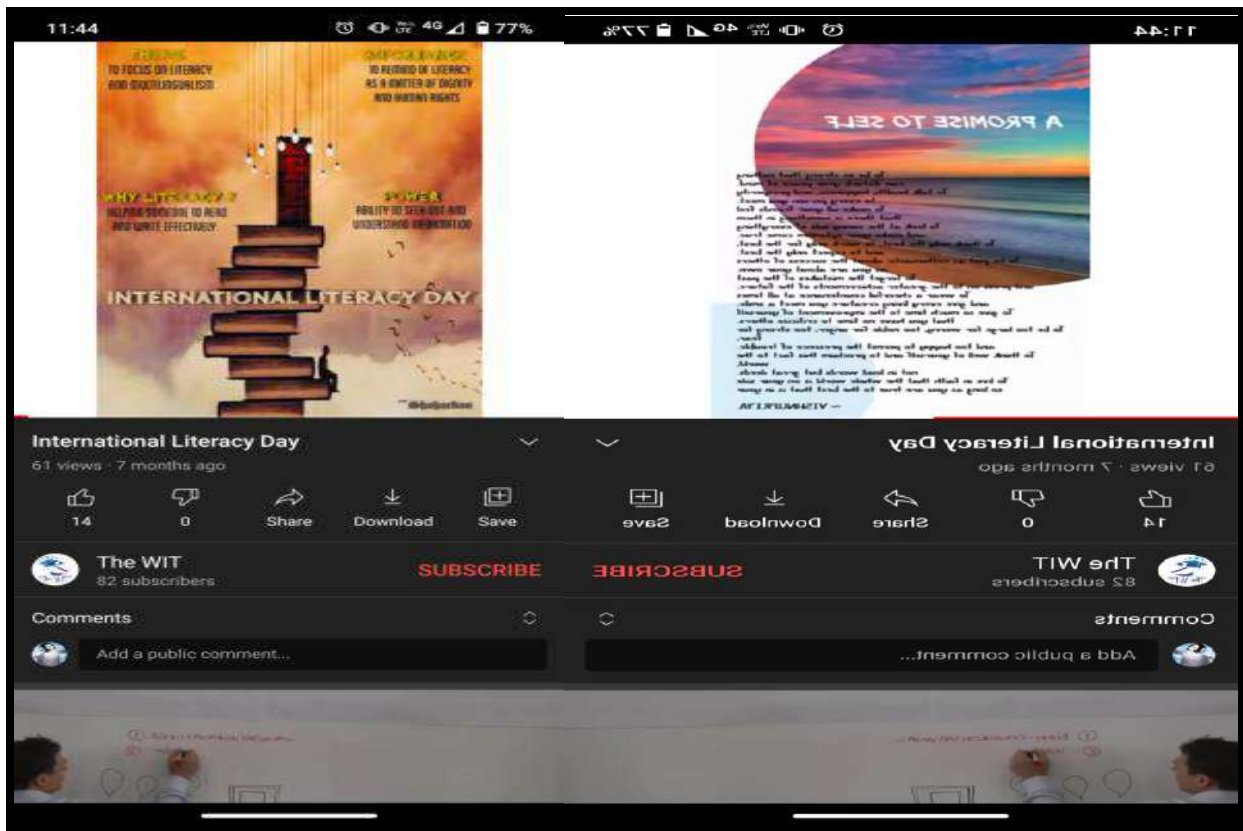


INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY – 8 SEPTEMBER 2020

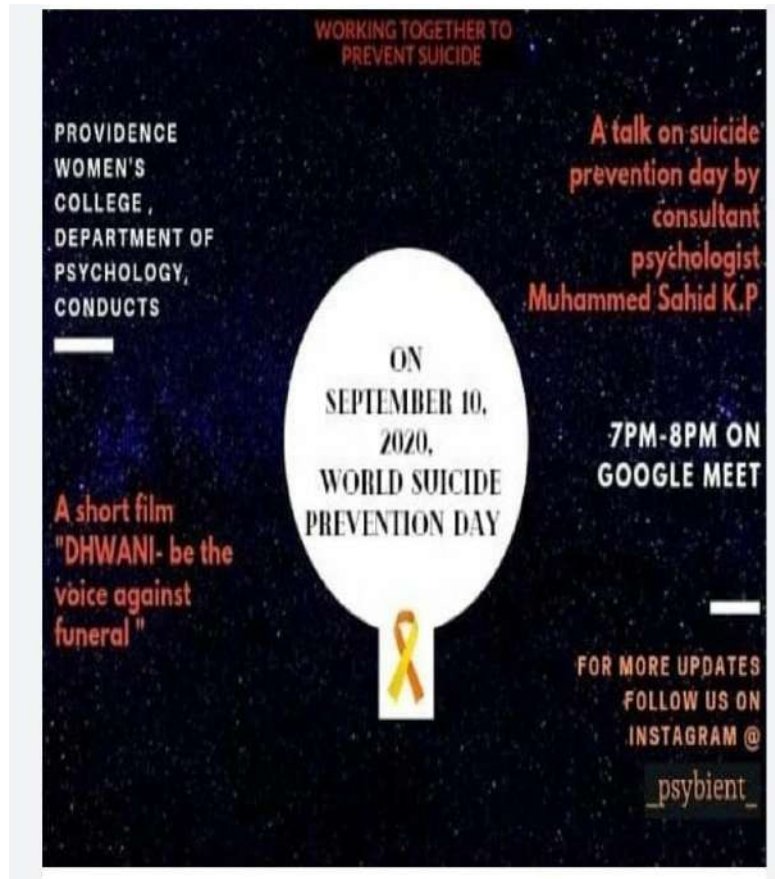

The Department of Physics observed the Ozone day by switching off all CFC emitting appliances for one hour.

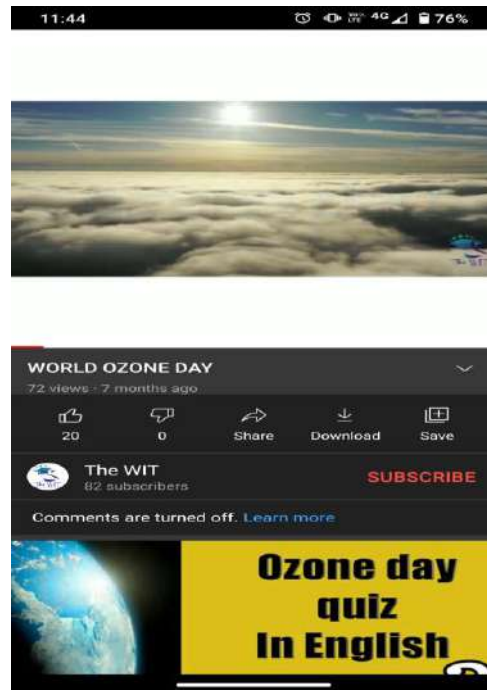

WORLD DEVELOPMENT INFORMATION DAY- 24 OCTOBER 2020




Providence Women's College, Department of Computer Science conducted World Development Information Day on 24th October 2020. This day is observed to help draw the attention of people worldwide to the major development problems faced by mankind. A further aim of the event was to explain to the general public why it is necessary to strengthen international cooperation to find ways to sort out these issues. No society can move forward without resolving the major problems faced by our community. In recent years many events have interpreted the title of the day slightly differently. These events have concentrated on the role that modern information-technologies, such as the Internet and mobile telephones free from digital divide can play in alerting people and finding solutions to problems of trade and development. One of the specific aims of World Development Information Day was to inform and motivate young people and this change may help to further accomplish global development.

The NSS units celebrated Children's day by conducting inter-school online elocution competitions. Students from various schools participated in the event and grand responses were received.





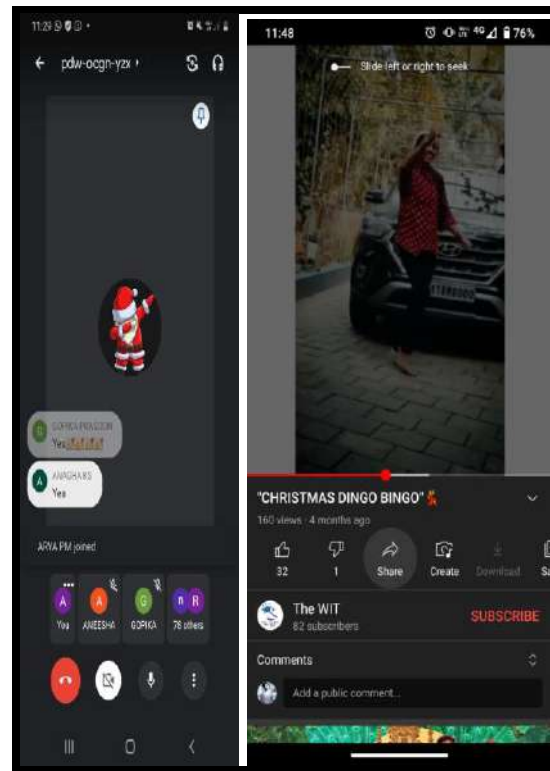




BOUN NATALE

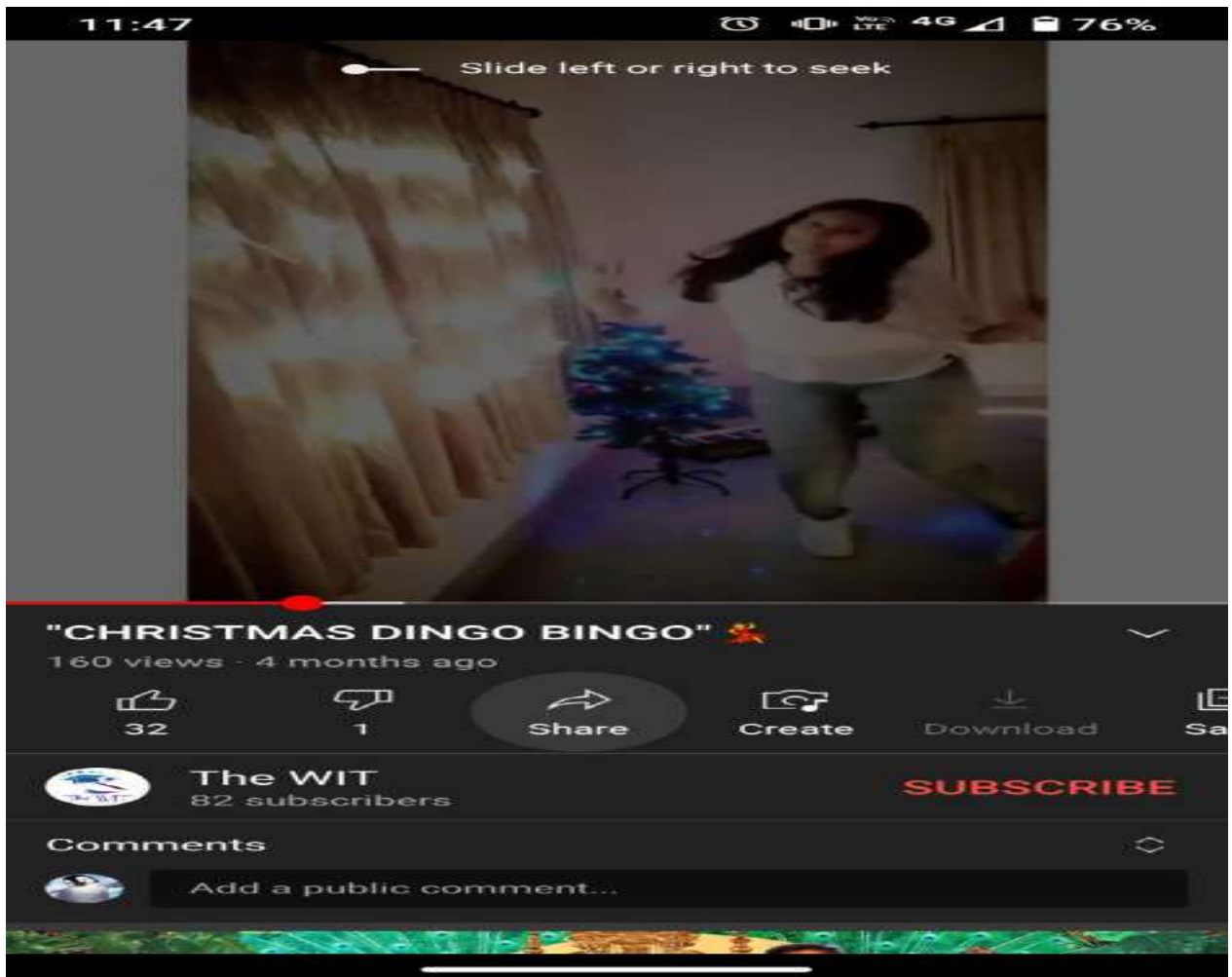
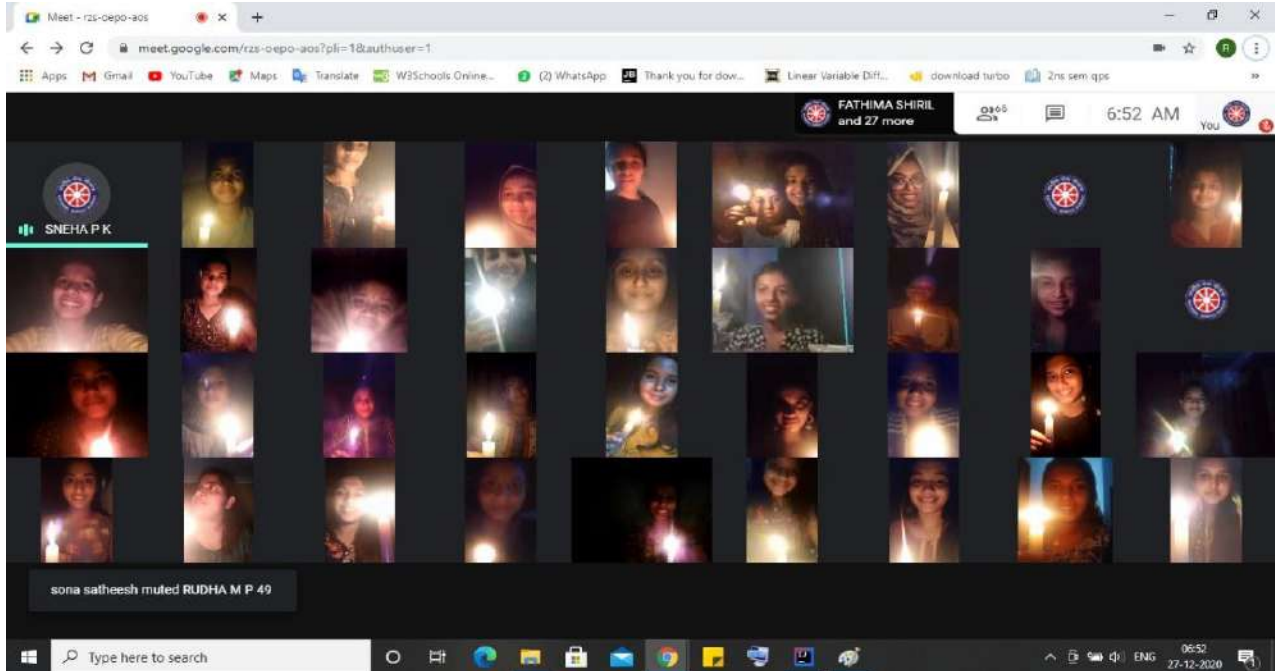

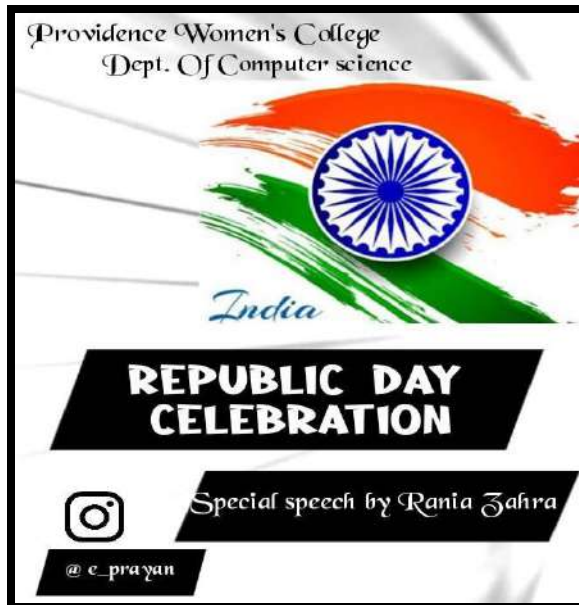
VOTER'S DAY- 25 JANUARY 2021

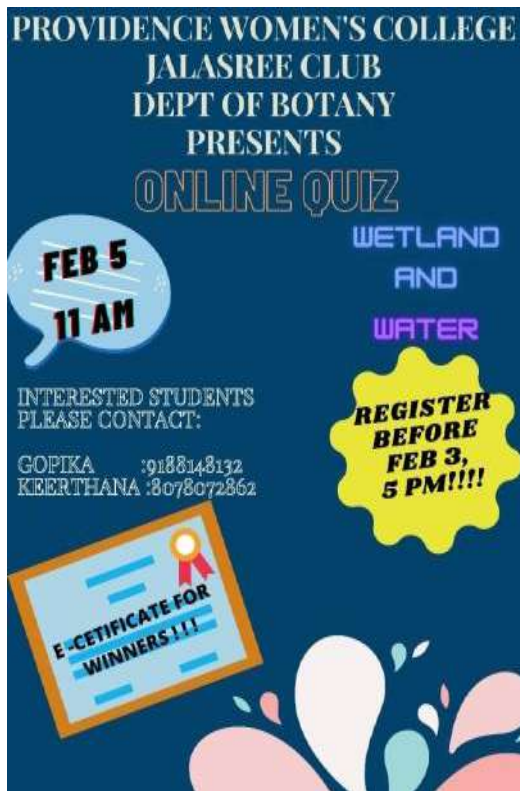
WORLD CANCER DAY-04 January

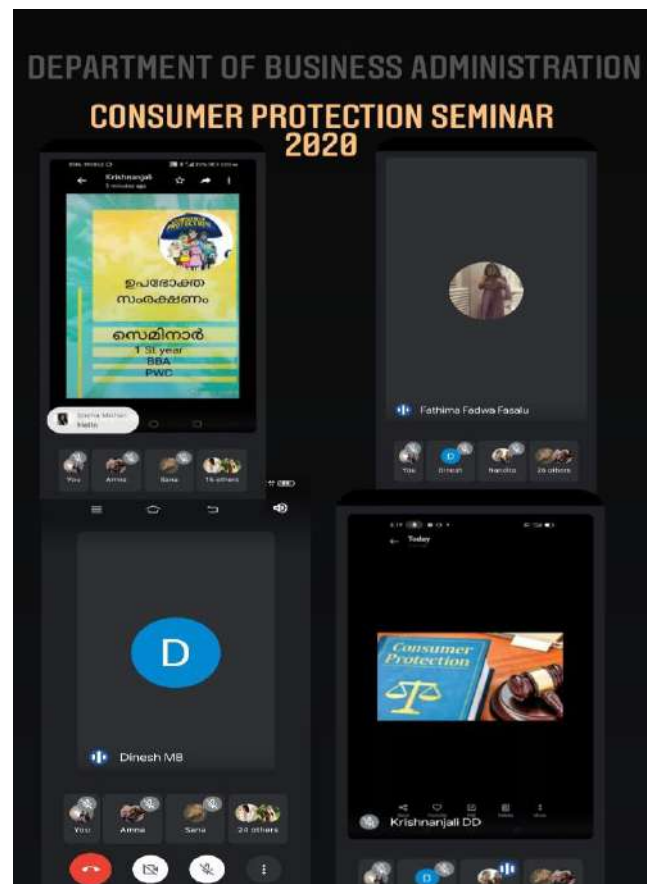

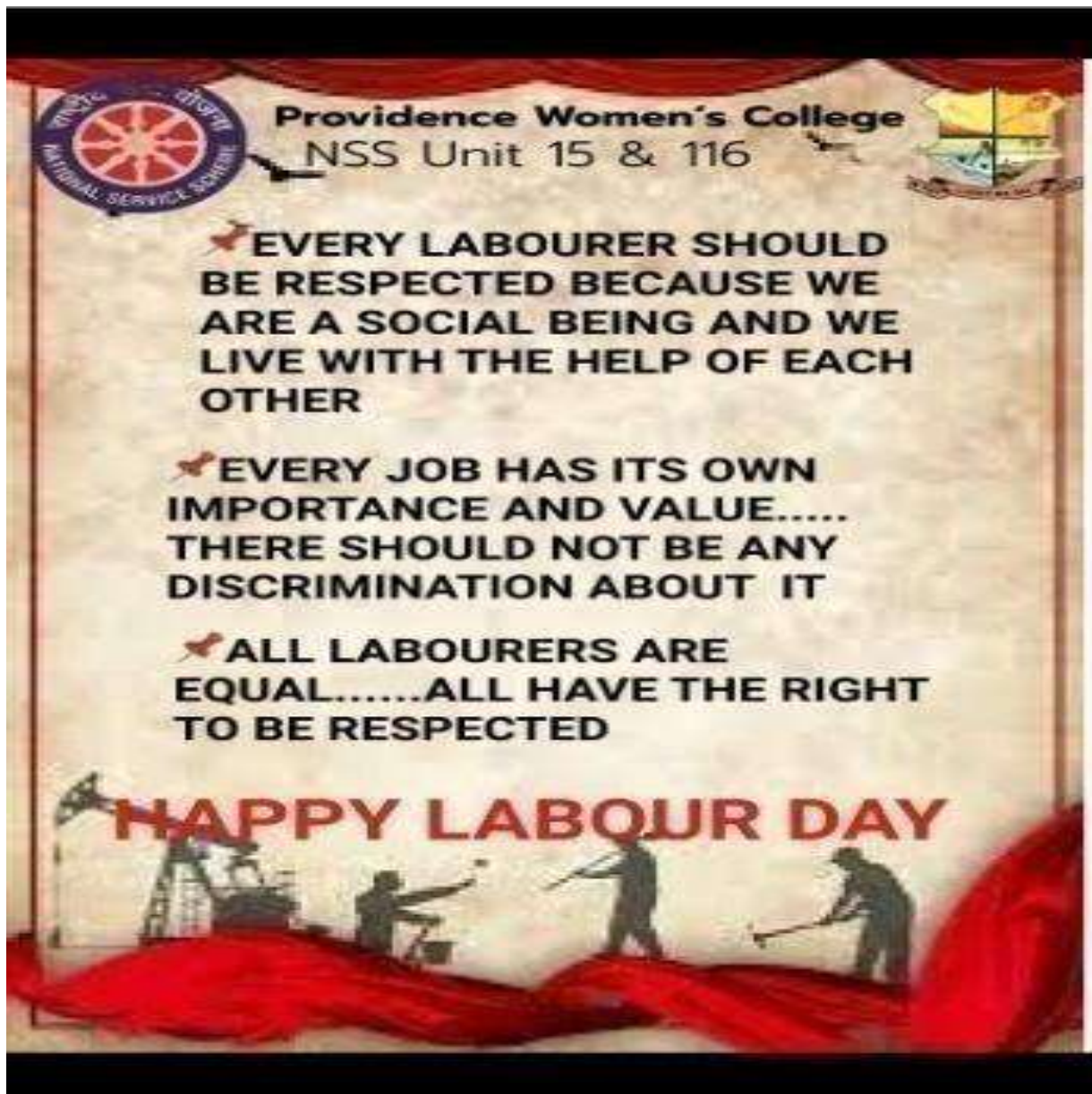

NURSE'S DAY: 12 MAY 2021



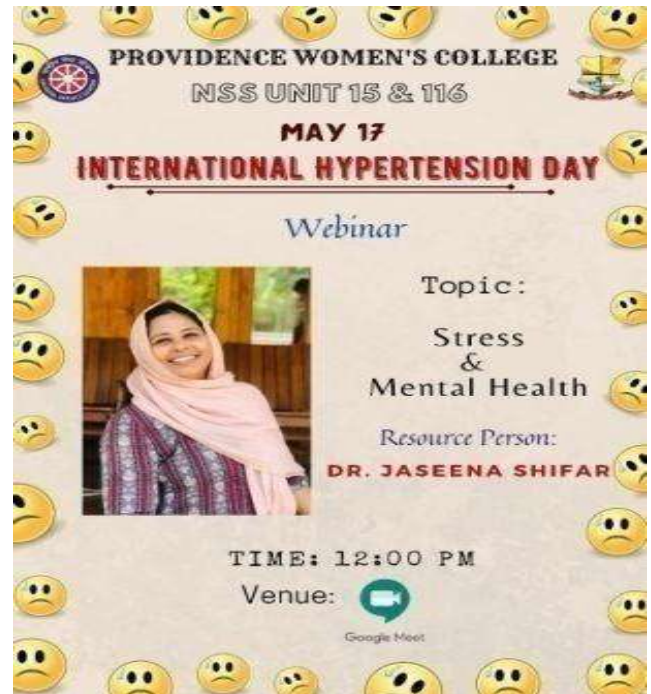

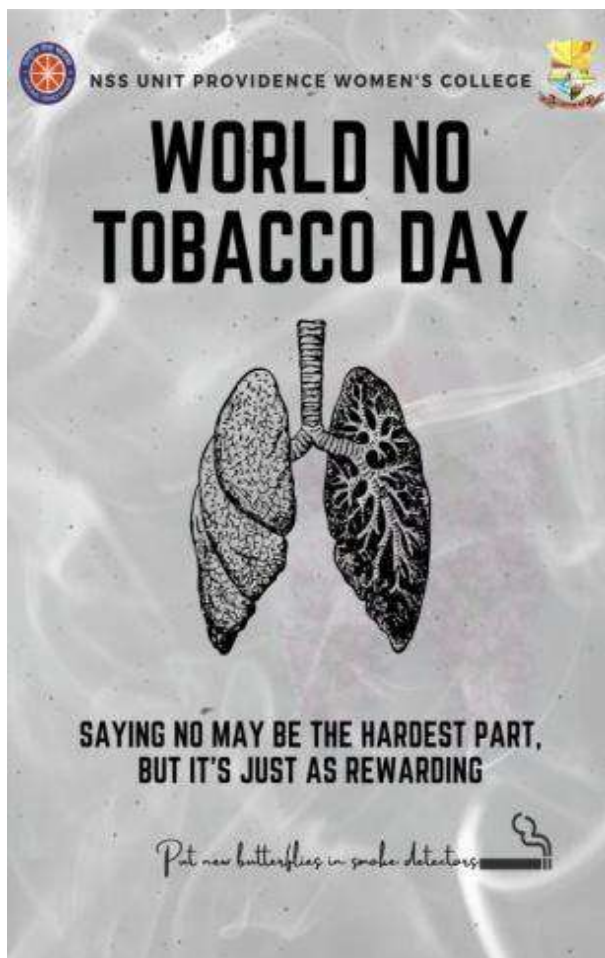
