
Acting on the advice of the Peer Team that visited the college as part of the third cycle of Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC in August 2017, the IQAC devised a scheme to elicit feedback from the stakeholders of the college. Prime relevance was accorded to the feedback from the employers of the students who graduated from the college. The employers were contacted for their feedback on the college and its curriculum based on the performance of the employees. The following is the report based on the feedback analysis:


Does the college make the students competent for employment in the industry? 60% of the employers rated the college and its curriculum to be making the students fit for employment in the industry.

Innovative thinking developed by the curriculum of the college: 60% of the employees have rated the innovative thinking developed by the curriculum in the employees as good, but 40% rate it as average.

Sense of Responsibility in the Employees: 100% of the employers have rated the college as very good in training its students and instilling the value of responsibility in them. Team Playing Ability of the Employees: 80% of the employers appreciated the performance of the employees as good team players.

Does the College Equip the Students to Face New Age Challenges? 50% of the employers have rated the training given in the college as empowering the students to face new-age challenges, but the same percentage rates it as below average.







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## **Department Wise Action Taken Report**

### **PROVIDENCE WOMEN'S COLLEGE, KOZHIKODE**



#### ACTION TAKEN REPORT BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM STAKEHOLDERS, 2017-18

The IQAC, acting on the recommendations of the Peer Team that visited the college for the Third Cycle of Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC in August 2017, diversified the process of collecting annual feedback on the performance of the college. Apart from the yearly feedback collected from the students, feedback from the other stakeholders – teachers, alumnae, and employers – was collected. The IQAC devised the format of the forms to collect the relevant data. The feedback of the students was analysed in the month of March, and the recommendations thereon conveyed to the MGB, which deliberated on the points at the meeting held on 22/3/2018. The recommendations based on the feedback from teachers, alumni and employers were analysed by the IQAC and conveyed to the MGB, which discussed the same at the next MGB Meeting on 26/6/2018. The IQAC also held meetings with the departments to discuss the feedback and proposed appropriate action for quality enhancement. The departments held departmental meetings to take further action on the feedback. Some of the recommendations and suggestions were forwarded by the departments to the Boards of Studies of the University of Calicut to make suggested changes in the syllabus and examination system.

The following is the summary of the action taken on the feedback received from the students, teachers, alumnae and employers in the year 2018:

- The Managing Governing Body of the college decided to launch a Library Building project to improve the Library facilities in the campus, as recommended by the Peer Team and as requested by the students and other stakeholders.
- The college submitted the application to the affiliating University for Autonomous Status to diversify the Courses offered by the college.
- 3. The college submitted applications to the University for the upgrading of the departments of English and Botany as Research Centres.



- The college also submitted applications for new courses, prioritising PG Courses in the departments that are fully qualified for the same – Chemistry, History and Economics.
- In response to the widespread demand from the staff, the college stepped up the Wi-Fi facilities in the campus with a new BSNL connection.
- 6. The Principal directed the departments to make Skill Development courses and Certificate Courses mandatory in each department of the college.
- In response to the recommendations of the NAAC Peer Team and feedback from employers, the college submitted applications to the UGC for the sanction of B.Voc. Courses.
- 8. The Managing Governing Body expedited the process of filling up the existing vacancies.
- 9. The college made effective utilisation of the CPE Funds for infrastructure development and improvement of Teaching and Learning with augmented ICT facilities and made it mandatory for Departments to organise International Seminars using the CPE funding
- 10. The IQAC followed up the application for RUSA Funding
- 11. The IQAC continued the Linkages with ICT Academy of Kerala and signed MoUs with organisations to improve the employment opportunities for students.
- The NSS Unit of the college boosted the organic farming projects taken up by the students both inside and outside the campus.

#### **Department-Wise Action Taken Report**

- Botany: The Department submitted the application to be upgraded as a Research Centre since it has fulfilled all the criteria and there is strong demand from the students for a research centre in Botany. In response to the demand for international exposure, the department hosted Dr.Vince Vinan of the University of Kent
- 2. Business Administration: The Department promoted the practice of Internships among the students, to boost their industry-readiness. Career Guidance Sessions were organised in association with T.I.M.E. Academy
- 3. Commerce: The Department offered a new Certificate Course in Tally ERP-9, and organised a National Seminar on "Changing Paradigms of Organisation in the Era



of the Fourth Industrial Revolution", and regional-level seminars on Online Education, Financial Markets, GST, SAP and CMA.

- 4. Computer Science: The Department upgraded the facilities in the Computer lab with the use of CPE funds, and applied for funding to the MLA under the Local Development Fund. The department organised an IT Fest, and an interactive session on IoT in association with Symptots, Kozhikode, in response to the demand for better exposure to the industry requirements.
- Economics: The department organised a seminar on NSSO and Employment in association with NSSO. An Exhibition on Career Opportunities in Economics – EXPO – was organised by the department.
- 6. English: The Department submitted recommendations to the Board of Studies in English for changes in the BA English Language and Literature. The department organised a Literature Festival based on the feedback given on the success of the previous year's Literature Fest. The PG Students' Seminar was made an annual programme of the department.
- 7. History: The department collaborated with the Sarvodaya Sangh to conduct seminars to observe the 150<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, and also organised sessions with eminent scholars on Historiography, Pluralism, Water Politics, Epigraphy and the new VVPAT system in the election process.
- 8. Mathematics: The department organised sessions with eminent scholars on Euclidean Spaces, and Quality Assurance in Official Statistics.
- Physics: Conducted a Mini School on Gravitation and Cosmology in collaboration with IUCAA, Pune, a National Seminar on Thermodynamics, and organised workshops on LED lamp making, 3D Printing and Drone Plotting.
- 10. Psychology: The department organised a Seminar on Psyche, and conducted sessions on PTSD, New Mental Health Model, and Anti-suicide measures in response to the suggestions given by the students.
- 11. Travel and Tourism: Undertook Heritage Walks with experts in the field to give the students the requested practical training. The department also organised a Tourism Fest to give the students a broader exposure to the industry.
- 12. Zoology: The Dept. organised seminars and a poster exhibition on the Wildlife and Endemic Fauna of the Western Ghats, and organised a Career Guidance Session on Career Opportunities for Zoology Graduates. These were done in response to the feedback given by the students and the alumni of the department.
