


ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK FROM THE STUDENTS AND THE ACTION TAKEN (2021-22)


Feedback from the students was collected through three different questionnaires by the IQAC and the Feedback Evaluation Committee consisting of the Heads of all the departments.

- 1. From the students of Humanities and Literature
- 2. From the students of Science and Mathematics
- 3. From the Students of Commerce and Business Management

Three forms were circulated among students of different programmes, to get back an accurate curriculum specific feedback. The diversity in the curriculum needed separate forms as it helped the students to be more specific and precise while giving their responses. Questions pertained to the structure of the curriculum, the need for updating it, academic performance of the faculty and academic ambience of the college. The questions on the curriculum tried to assess the responses of the students to Course Objectives and Course Outcomes. Students were quick enough to respond and this has enabled the feedback evaluation committee led by the IQAC to analyse and consolidate it. Departments concerned were intimated and action was taken to bring forth various suggestions given by the students.




39.5% of the respondents have rated that the syllabus inculcated curiosity in them to a large extent, only 5.8% of the respondents denied it.

4. Has it imparted intellectual skills like critical faculty and analytical thinking in you?




5. Has it enabled you to understand cross-cutting issues like gender/caste/pluralism/racism/economic development in the present context








Majority of the respondents agreed that the curriculum offered sufficient insights on literature/past/culture/heritage/economy etc. only 3.5% denied it.



9. Has the syllabus helped you to identify and contribute to the local, national and global changes?










4.Did the curriculum inspire a scientific temperament in you?






Majority of the faculty (66.7%) suggested that the academic content of the curriculum was good.7.7% marked it excellent and 25.6% suggested that it needed improvement.









9.Are you happy with the academic performance of the college? Kindly elucidate.

Yes, but the way the university conducts the exams, overlaping multiple semesters, and the delay in announcing the results are the main reasons for the students not getting the chance to improve their results during the BSc programme. Some of us who have taken part in the discussion are members of major teachers' organisations, and are very well aware how much voice the teachers have in the executive decisions of the university in matters related to examinations and results.

Only partially. A marginal decrease in the performance of the students especially in competitive exams is observed with the onset of the pandemic. The whole teaching learning methods and the evaluation schemes have been changed. These all might have a negative impact on both slow and fast learners. The chances for individual attention and monitoring of student during class time is diminished in online mode. Moreover the introduction of ceiling in the examination has changed the mindset of students. Most of the students show reluctance for deep study and are seem to be very happy with the high score getting via ceiling system.

I feel it's our duty to bring back the student community who really wants to learn the concept clearly rather than scoring some marks easily.

ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY TEACHERS


Majority of the teachers were happy with the academic content of the curriculum. They remarked that the college gave them sufficient opportunities to adopt new strategies in teaching-learning. Majority of the teachers were satisfied with how the college rose to the occasion in curriculum delivery and its transaction during the pandemic. Effective Learning Management Systems viz., Moodle helped the students to cope up with the challenges during the Covid-19 pandemic. However, the teachers expressed serious concern about how individual monitoring and attention given to students diminished dismally in the wake of online teaching.

Faculty suggested more industrial interactions and professional development programmes. A major concern was about the haphazardly - scheduled academic calendar of the affiliating university which put the students under stress and uncertainty.

In response to the feedback from teachers, the college decided to direct the Board of Studies members to convey the difficulties faced by the students to the University during the pandemic. Extensive topics had to be reduced and redundant topics had to be removed from the curriculum so as to suit the requirement of the changing global educational scenario. The Managing Governing Body and the Principal agreed to take all steps to provide holistic and quality education to the students.






ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY THE ALUMNAE




ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY EMPLOYERS

One was regarding their concern on giving more problem solving sessions for which the teachers decided to divide each class into 8-10 groups and give each group different questions so that they can solve them and one from each group can present it in the class. This can improve their problem solving, group discussions and presentation skills. Then they can consolidate all the solved questions into an assignment and submit it to the teacher in charge. Another worry they raised was regarding the improvement of the syllabus so that it helps them crack national entrance exams. Quizzes and debates are also planned to improve their awareness in the main subject, in other subjects and in their general knowledge. The next concern was regarding internships. For this, the department has decided to collaborate with NIT Calicut so that students can do projects and certified internships under various professors of the department of Mathematics of the institute. The last major problem was regarding the vast syllabus and the number of special classes taken to finish the portions at the end of the semester. The concern regarding Syllabus has been raised to the University and we are waiting for a positive response. The department has decided to keep special classes for all B.Sc Mathematics students everyday from the start of the semester so that we get time to finish the portions, for the problem solving session, quizzes and debates and thus they don't feel the burden at the end of the semester.





DEPARTMENT WISE ACTION TAKEN REPORT AND STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK ANALYSIS-2021-22

The college has a well-structured mechanism to collect feedback every year from various stakeholders like students, alumnae, employers and teachers. We give prime importance to implement the valuable suggestions given by the stakeholders to improve the academic ambience. The diligent faculty strive their best to excel in academic performance. Amidst all the challenges posed by the pandemic, the college has tried its best to impart quality education to the students last year. A department specific Action Taken Report has been prepared after analysing the feedback with utmost caution and care. Since the institution is an affiliated college, it has to follow the curriculum formulated by the university. But we take a lot of effort to take action according to the suggestions from stakeholders regarding the curriculum and its transaction.

ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY STUDENTS

The Department of English

There were suggestions for more group activities like debates and discussions in the feedback given by the students. Activities have been stepped up taking into consideration their suggestions. One idea mooted by the student community is under consideration, which is to constitute houses within the college to bring in some competitive spirit and ensure cooperation between different departments. It will also give ample opportunities for the students to mingle well. Prizes can be awarded at the end of the year for the best house based on their academic and extracurricular performances. We have implemented the suggestion that teachers ask questions during lectures as it would help to stimulate learning, stir the imagination and help to clarify ideas.

The suggestion to encourage students who are poor in studies has led to intensifying remedial teaching and strengthening academic adoption. The department responded positively to the suggestions to have interview preparation classes, life skill classes and mental health awareness programmes.

The Department of Commerce

In order to improve the academic ambience of the college, it was decided to have discussions with students and identify the area that needs improvement. The department will strive to introduce innovative teaching methods that would generate interest in the discipline.

The Department of Business Administration

The feedback collected by the Department of Business Administration suggested how the curriculum should be updated enough to cater to the requirements of the present-day job market. The teachers were encouraged to adopt more innovative techniques and strategies for teaching. Students should be involved in more projects and internships. The Department decided to devise methods that could facilitate it. Memoranda of Understanding have been signed with reputed institutions for more project related study and provide expertise for short term courses. Various capacity building and skill enhancement (life skill, soft skill, language and communication skill programmes) are provided to the students for equipping them to suit the requirements of the current job market. Books from the Indian Institute of Management were collected for the students to get an in-depth knowledge in the discipline.

The Department of Botany

In order to increase the involvement of all students in extracurricular activities, the number of extra-curricular activities were increased to break the monotony of routine classes and it was ensured that every student was taking part in at least one activity. Time was assigned for one-on-one teacher-student interaction and discussions were ensured to provide time for clearing doubts and career opportunities. Small class tests were conducted as the students felt that this would help them get over the fear of facing exams. To develop their practical knowledge and to equip them with skills, certificate courses were provided, which will not only help them in the progression of the career they would choose but also in their everyday life.

The Department of Travel and Tourism Management

Students of The Department of Travel and Tourism Management suggested updating the activity-oriented programmes every year and to increase the number of books on Tourism in the department library. As it is a semi-professional course, they prefer programmes which would give them more exposure to various skill development activities rather than classroom teaching. Due to the spread of covid-19, the Department was not able to send students for various skill development programmes. Analysing the students' feedback, it was decided to give importance to experiential learning and skill development programmes (Job training programmes, workshops and study tour). The dept offers various short-term courses for personality development and seminars on confidence building. Responding to the feedback from students, the Department included more activity-oriented programmes in academics, motivated students to engage in self-discovery learning, promoted opportunities to understand the heritage and history of undiscovered places in Calicut and motivated all students to participate in curricular activities.

The Department of Computer Science

Action Taken Report for the year 2021-2022 includes more attention on hands-on training, job-oriented activities and workshops. The Department is planning to include more practical sessions for students. In the academic year, fests related to Information Technology would be conducted with different programmes and exhibitions. The department is planning to conduct

inter —department programmes for the students and also to provide more hands-on projects, certificate courses and seminars.

The department has decided to motivate the students to concentrate on publishing academic articles and pursue research-oriented activities. Efforts will be taken to materialize industrial visits to various IT parks which couldn't be carried out due to the pandemic previous year.

The department decided to include more practical classes focused on coding, provide joboriented workshops and to offer short-term courses. Arrangements for more internships from established companies is under serious consideration. Other decisions are to give more attention to Mathematics and Statistics classes and to provide coaching based on subjects (UG students) which will prove useful for preparation for PG entrance and NET exams.

The Department of Economics

Since field work and survey could not be done due to the pandemic situation, permission was given to conduct online surveys for primary data collection. As online trading is not included in the Capital Market course, it was taught as part of the certificate course 'Introduction to Finance market.' Availability of study materials was limited due to less library access during lockdown and this was overcome by making arrangements to access college and department libraries this year in a systematic manner. Recorded classes were provided in response to connectivity and range issues during live sessions.

The Department of Psychology

In cue to this, the department has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with various psychological centres and colleges to give the best exposure to the students. Students are also encouraged to attend both online and offline internship programs offered by different organizations across the globe.

The Department of History

In the feedback students suggested that national and international seminars should be organized that would give them more opportunities to interact with renowned scholars, writers and historians. The department has decided to take necessary steps in order to conduct such seminars that would give them more chances to plan, execute and organize events which were predominantly conducted online due to the pandemic in the last two years. There are various clubs like Darpan (the Political Forum, Sanskriti (the Cultural Forum), Vaiga (the quiz club, Ayur (the Health Club) and Janathi (the Legal Awareness Club) that function under the auspices of the department and it was decided to organize more activities under the banner of each club. The function of the clubs would be in a structured way with a student secretary chalking out plans and executing it so as to facilitate the smooth functioning of the club. The student council will be more actively involved in the planning and execution of the programmes. Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav-India @75 to be observed with myriad programmes this year as it would ensure more student participation and inclusion, a very important suggestion in the student feedback.

Cultural and historical mapping of the places in Malabar will be done this year with the intention to make group learning more effective. This project would enable them to create a better understanding of local history. It will certainly enable them to delve into the history of the locality, its diversity and uniqueness. The project will also give them an opportunity to work in groups and provide practical exposure, yet another significant suggestion in the feedback

Field trips to archaeological and heritage sites that would help the students to understand the discipline better and offer more scope for experiential learning have been chalked out. The number of research oriented and career-oriented programmes plans will be enhanced this year. Peer tutoring will be strictly monitored as it will be beneficial to the weak and advanced learners.

Quizzes and debates are also planned to improve their awareness in the main subject, in other subjects

and in their general knowledge. The next concern was regarding internships. Curriculum needs to develop practical knowledge rather than focusing only on theory portions. Feedback received was that the industry training they were given was very less. Students are satisfied with the academic ambience of the college and the academic performance of the faculty. More than half of the students expressed their interest in recommending the college to others but suggested the involvement of all students in extracurricular activities. Requested more discussion time with respective teachers regarding doubt clearing doubts and for advice on future opportunities of the course.

Action Taken

- Decided to give more questions for practice and monitored the understanding of the level of each student and made them write competitive exams.
- One-to-one teacher-student interaction should be done and strengthen the remedial classes
- Faculty should identify innovative methods to generate interest in the discipline and connect the subject with their day-to-day life
- Mandatory Internships/Skill development were introduced and industry-oriented certificate courses helped in hands-on training
- Respective tutors should make sure that each student is taking part in various cocurricular and extracurricular activities arranged for the students.

Department of Zoology

The students of the Department suggested arranging coaching classes that would help them crack competitive examinations. Improvement of infrastructure, viz., lab and library facilities were yet another suggestion.

The Department took feedback from the students on the effectiveness of teaching the core paper -ZOL3BO3. Students marked their feedback on the following modules.

1.Introduction and diversity of the chordates, 2. Classification of Chordata 3. Introduction to Urochordata 4.Introduction of Cephalochordate

After the analysis the following actions were taken by the Department,

1.Revision of tough topics was undertaken.2. Remedial classes were taken for weak students.3. Study materials were provided to weak students.4. Strict maintenance of students' attendance and .5. Encouragement given to read more books

ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY EMPLOYERS

In general, the employers were impressed by the performance of the alumnae of Providence Women's College who displayed confidence, dedication and commitment to the job. However, they felt that the curriculum had to be updated, giving more importance to experiential/practical learning to meet the needs of the job market. The college has signed a good number of Memorandums of Understanding with industries, IT firms in response to this feedback from the employers. The College will also provide all the logistical support to the students doing internship courses and short-term courses that will help them to gain more practical knowledge of the topics related to the curriculum. In order to improve the interpersonal skills of the students, more effort will be taken by giving them classes in spoken English and personality development

ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY THE ALUMNAE

The alumnae, a major stakeholder of the College, actively participate in all the activities held in the campus. Their contribution in rendering academic support to uplift research in the college is remarkable. In the feedback they acknowledged the benefits of the value education course imparted to them when they were students of the college. In response to the feedback from the alumnae the college decided to give more importance to research oriented activities and experiential learning. Yet another suggestion was to give the students coaching that would enable them to crack the competitive examinations like MAT/CAT, NET/JRF, UPSC exams etc

ACTION TAKEN ON THE FEEDBACK GIVEN BY TEACHERS

Majority of the teachers were happy with the academic content of the curriculum. They remarked that the college gave them sufficient opportunities to adopt new strategies in teaching- learning. Majority of the teachers were satisfied with how the college rose to the occasion in curriculum delivery and its transaction during the pandemic. Effective Learning Management Systems viz., Moodle helped the students to cope up with the challenges during the Covid-19 pandemic. However, the teachers expressed serious concern about how individual monitoring and attention given to students diminished dismally in the wake of online teaching.

Faculty suggested more industrial interactions and professional development programmes. A major concern was about the haphazardly - scheduled academic calendar of the affiliating university which put the students under stress and uncertainty.

In response to the feedback from teachers, the college decided to direct the Board of Studies members to convey the difficulties faced by the students to the University during the pandemic. Extensive topics had to be reduced and redundant topics had to be removed from

the curriculum so as to suit the requirement of the changing global educational scenario. The Managing Governing Body and the Principal agreed to take all steps to provide holistic and quality education to the students.

Conclusion

The overall change in the learning process from offline mode to online, due to covid-19 pandemic warranted teachers attending webinars to equip themselves with various tools on Econtent development for effective teaching. New apps like "Teachmint," are being used to conduct online classes which are made more effective by giving various group activities, quizzes, and assignments to the students. Besides revision classes, teachers increased interaction with students to give them a positive energy minimizing depression triggered by the current situation. Weekly online value education classes are being conducted for students, which helps them to shape their future and to know the purpose of their life. It helps them to become more responsible and sensible. PTA meetings held through online platforms request parents to ensure a proper follow-up. Evaluation of students' performance was by conducting online viva and tests via Google-form and Google classrooms. Students are motivated to register for various certificate courses, available on platforms like "Swayam, NPTEL etc".

Students are entrusted with coordinating various programs involving preparation of brochures and reports for the same, thus helping them to develop various skills. Various webinars on life skills, soft skills are being arranged for students to prepare them for the job market. In addition to this, various cells, like career guidance cell, Research & Development Cell etc. of the college also motivate the students to participate in various webinars on how to utilise post Covid opportunities, crack competitive exams and secure dream jobs, internships, etc. Students are encouraged to enrol for certificate courses. Their suggestion to increase the opportunity for certificate courses led to the decision to give them awareness about online certificate courses offered by different Universities abroad.
