ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME (ASAP)

Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP), a joint initiative of General and Higher Education Departments, Govt. of Kerala was launched with an objective to impart quality skill education to the higher secondary / undergraduate students alongside their regular curriculum. The 180 hrs long foundation module delivers communicative skills and basics of IT.Skill course training of 120-250 hours was also offered to the students. The Foundation Module for 2018 started on January 3rd with a capacity of 19 students. In 2019 a batch of 15 students enrolled themselves with ASAP on January 7th.

The Foundation Module consists of two parts. First part is of five units: 1. Personal Skills; 2. Social Skills; 3. Organisational Skills; 4. Professional Skills and 5. Preparing and Presenting a Project. The second part is IT Module. It is of four units: 1. Introduction to Internet, word processing tools and Emailing; 2. Operating Systems, Image Editing and Presentation, Internet, Malayalam in Computer; 3. Spreadsheet Tools, Internet Transaction Service and 4. Final Project and Evaluation.
