ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME (ASAP)

Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) , a joint initiative of General and Higher Education Departments, Govt. of Kerala was launched with an objective to impart quality skill education to the higher secondary / undergraduate students alongside their regular curriculum. The 180 hrs long foundation module delivers communicative skills and basics of IT. Skill course training of 120 – 250 hours was also offered to the students. Operating Systems, Image Editing and Presentation, Internet, Malayalam in Computer; 3. Spreadsheet Tools, Internet Transaction Service and 4. Final Project and Evaluation.
